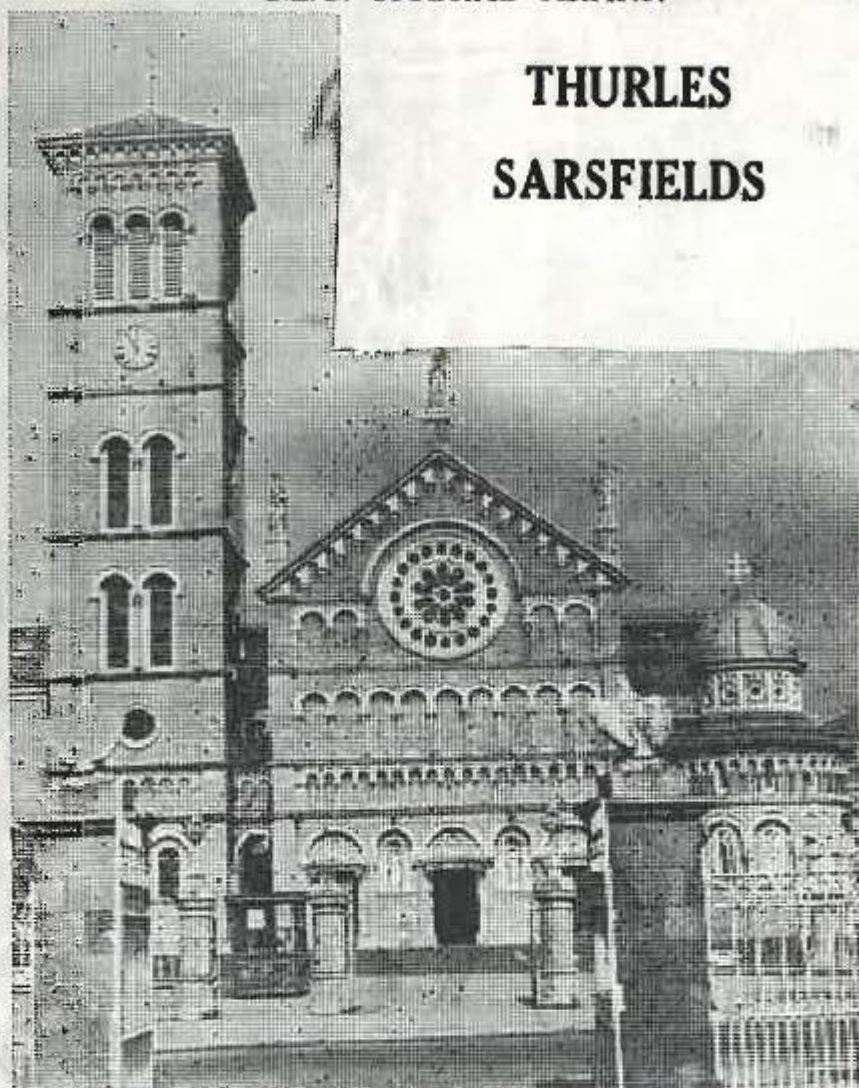

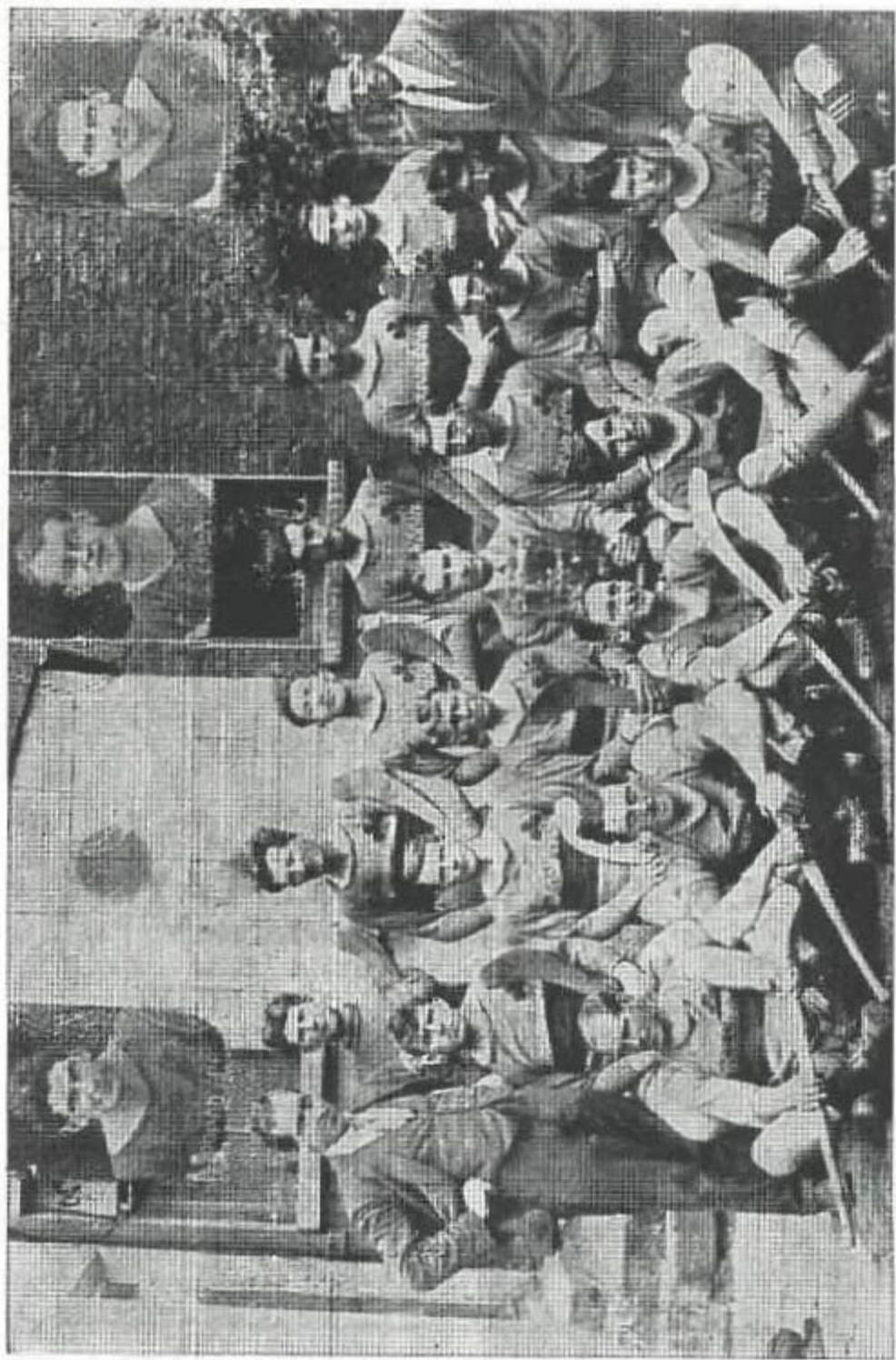

Do You Remember . . .

Fifty years ago, Tipperary, represented by a Boherlahan selection, won the All-Ireland senior hurling title by defeating Galway by 5-6 to 1-5, the county's tenth championship, and the first occasion they wore the famed Blue and Gold as we know it today.

We are honoured in having present at today's game survivors of that great occasion in the persons of Martin Kennedy (Toomevara), Tom Duffy (Lorrha), John Joe Hayes (Moycarkey-Borris), Paddy Dwyer (Boherlahan), Jack Power (Boherlahan and New York), Rody Nealon (Youghalarra), and Willie O'Dwyer, who was secretary of the Boherlahan club at that time.

On the way to the final, Tipperary defeated Kerry, Cork in a thriller, and Waterford in the Munster final. Antrim proved no problem in the semi-final, and it is reported that thirty specials brought the crowd to Dublin for the final against Galway.

In the course of a report on the game, the Gaelic Athlete says—It was the old story—the Tipperary dash carried all before it. Leahy and his kinsmen went at it, kept at it, with all the skill and might and splendour traditional to the county. The pigeon went south with a cheering message. Holding the McCarthy Cup—symbol of triumph—in his hand, the Boherlahan captain was carried shoulder high around the field.

Incidentally, it was in 1925 that the McCarthy Cup was first awarded for the All-Ireland senior hurling championship.
