ROSCREA SPRING CONFERENCE ON EARLY CHRISTIAN IRELAND.

SWISS COTTAGE, CAHIR PARK.

This is probably the finest surviving 'Cottage Ornee' in the world. The Swiss Cottage in Cahir Park was officially opened and handed over to the state on September 1st, 1989. The Cottage has been salvaged and completely renovated, primarily, with funds from the Port Royal Foundation. A detailed and illustrated description by Mark Girovard appeared in the October 26th issue of 'Country Life'. Another article is due to appear in the March edition of 'House and Garden' (USA edition). The Cottage is due to re-open officially in March, 1990.

This is a full length biographical story of Michael Cusack, the founder of the G.A.A. It is a compelling book for any G.A.A. follower to read, as it gives a wonderful background to how the Gaelic Association was founded and the difficulties it encountered in it's early years. (1989)

HISTORY OF SOUTH TIPPERARY. BY PATRICK C. POWER.

The story of the land - who owned it, who took it, what was done with it, how its destiny was shaped from the early Christian days to the twenty first century, including both political and social history.

WILLIAM SMITH O'BRIEN BY RD. DAVIS OF TASMANIA.

A study of the young Irelander Wm. Smith O'Brien's life from his youth to the "Warhouse" in Ballingarry, and finally to Tasmania. The author draws on the little known Tasmanian Journal kept by O'Brien for research on his exile years. Published by Geography Publications, Dublin (Wm Nolan).

THURLES, THE CATHEDRAL TOWN. BY WM. CORBETT AND WM. NOLAN.

A volume of essays on Thurles including its holy sites, medieval role, religious houses, the foundation of G.A.A. and many other interesting topics, by specialists in their respective fields. The book is in honour of His Grace, Most Reverend Dr. Morris for his valuable contribution to history in the Cashel and Emly Dioceses.
