#### TASMANIAN NEWS:

Following the successful Ireland-Tasmania Conference in Hobart in September 1988, at which Dr. Willie Nolan was guest of honour, the History Department of the University of Tasmania has obtained a sizeable grant from the Australian Research Council to work on several projects, including the initial Publication of William Smith O'Brien's Tasmanian Journal and a computerised data bank of all the Irish transported to Van Diemen's Land (a total of about 14,000 from all counties).

Smith O'Brien's Tasmanian Journal, unlike John Mitchel's famous Jail Journal, has never been published, probably because of the Unionist views of many of his immediate family. In the Journal, O'Brien gives not only an interesting description of Tasmania in the 1850's, but has much to say on Irish affairs and the reasons for the failure of his Tipperary Rebellion in July 1848.

The Irish Convict Data Bank when completed will correlate the very extensive Tasmanian convict records with the convict microfilms presented by the Irish Government as an Australian Bicentennial gift in 1988. As the Irish records give the date of trial in Ireland, it will be possible to follow the fate of individuals from their actions in Ireland through to the end of their convict careers in Tasmania. The computer will facilitate the extraction of particular groups (for example, Tipperary women convicted of arson) and will thus be an invaluable aid for local historians. On these projects, Tim Jetson, well qualified in both Irish and Tasmanian history will be working with Richard Davis and John Williams, the leading authority on Irish convicts in Van Diemen's Land and a contributor to The Tipperary Historical Journal.

Max Barret, author of "King of Galong Castle" will give talks on "Emigration to Australia 1840's to 1870's" An account of 420 from Clonoulty; "Fr. Mackey's Report on the Devon Commission re evictions in the Clonoulty area by Maude" and the social conditions of the time.

Afterwards the Australian party will go to "Irish Night" in the Golden Vale, Dundrum.
