ARCHAEOLOGISTS:- (i) The most recent number of the Journal of the Royal Society of Antiquaries of Ireland (Vol.118,1988), published some months ago, contained (pages 92-101) an article by Dorothy Kelly on cross-carved slabs found at an old church site at Latteragh, 8 miles south-east of Nenagh. (ii) The most recent issue of the North Antiquarian Journal (vol.XXIX,1987), published last Spring, contains (page 94) a note by Donal J. O'Riordan on a destroyed ringfort near Drom, Templemore, Co. Tipperary.

SITES AND MONUMENTS:

The sites and Monuments Record Office are at present compiling a record of archaeological monuments up to 1700 in date for Co. Tipperary. This work will involve a detailed study of map evidence, documentation contained in archaeological journals, loval histories, fieldwork reports and analysis of aerial coverage for the county. The information compiled will be computerised and distributed in the form of a check-list and marked-up maps to the county planning agencies, libraries and archaeological and historical societies within Co. Tipperary. This stage in the archaeological survey of Co. Tipperary is largely office intensive and will be supplemented by a limited amount of fieldwork. Therefore, the office of Public Works would be grateful for any information you might be able to give them regarding unmapped sites. The death took place of Tim Looney, Pearse St., Cahir, on the way home from the County Hurling Final in Thurles on Sunday, 14th Oct. 1990. As a young man he was all round Athlete and won many trophies in various sports. He was very involved with the G.A.A. both as a player, committee man, and in the juvenile age group. He was also a keen Beagler and open Coursing enthusiast. He had few equals as a local patriot and parish work. Tim's life long devotion to and love for parish history, research and folklore, marked him out as a man apart in these fields. He was also a noted authority on family research.
