A Note From The Editor

At a meeting in Thurles in August 1987, the County Tipperary Historical Society was founded. It's stated object was" to promote the study of the history, archaeology, folklore and geography of the county ... and to publish annually a journal". Three months later an editor was appointed, and twelve months later, the first issue of the Tipperary Historical Journal (1988) was launched in Holycross. We have now reached the 5th issue of the journal, and published no less than 1100 pages by 90 contributors. In addition, 3 pamphlets were published; Michael Moroney's "George Plant and the Rule of Law", Joseph Hayes' "Guide to Tipperary Newspapers" and Noreen Higgin's "Genealogical Sources for Co. Tipperary". The first issue of the Journal (1988), all 1,000 copies, was sold out within 6 months, as were the 500 or more of the Plant pamphlet.

The 6th issue of the Journal (1993) will, all going well, be ready by September. The principle articles to look forward to include a long contribution by Dr. Denis Marnane on the unpublished diaries of Samuel Cooper, a previously unpublished memoir on the War of Independence in North Tipperary by the late Sean Gaynor of Nenagh and the final instalment of Col. Tommy Ryan's account of the Third Tipperary Brigade 1917-1921. Also included will be a 5 year index of every article in the journal between 1988 and 1992 by Pat Nolan of Kilkenny, an extract from a thesis by Catherine Breathnach on Archbishop Brenan of Cashel, together with the usual complement of archaeology articles and book reviews.
