It gives me much pleasure to announce that a new Crest has been designed and will be available to all lovers of hurling, of Charles J. Kickham, and of Tipperary. The Badge, of cloth, is 94 x 74 cm. and can be sewn on to Blazers, Jerseys, Track-suits or Togs.

Too often have we bemoaned the fact that we have not got badges or stickers to match foreign influences. Now a start has been made and we hope there will be more to follow.

The motto: "For the Credit of the little Village" is taken from Kickham's "Knocknagow". The "County" of Tipperary is depicted in gold and the hurleys and sliotars white, over a blue background, which in my opinion represents the colours of Our Lady and the Universe. "Knocknagow" is another name for "Tiobraid Arann".

1982 being the Centenary of the death of Charles J. Kickham, "our truest patriot", I thought it fitting that he should be remembered in this way. It was Kickham who described the hurling match in "Knocknagow" and he it was who told of the great feat of "Matt the Thrasher" (a typical Tipperary man) when he threw the sledge "for the credit of the little village".

How often have we heard teams being exhorted before a match to "Go out there and play for the credit of the little village". There are some "who know not Kickham" or his high ideals.

I hope this Badge will help to imbue more

people with "a spirit of hurling", "the spirit of Tipperary" and a love for Knocknagow.

Let only those who seek to acquire or have acquired this spirit get or wear this Badge. Let them take pride in the Blue and Gold and when great deeds are to be done let it be done for God and Mary and—
"For the Credit of the Little Village".
