This is an historic day for the Burgess Club, as the Minor Footballers contest their first ever County 'A' Final against Fethard.

Football has made great strides in Burgess since the '90's. John Kissane from Kerry and Patsy Bonnar, a native of Donegal were invited to Burgess to coach the young players in 1992. They did great work concentrating on skill and speed. Pat Cremins, another Kerryman, also got involved later and the results follows.

Burgess won the U/16 'B' North Tipperary Championship in 1994, a second U/16 'B' North title in 1997 and a County Championship the same year. That team makes up today's panel. In 1996 the U/12 team won the County 'A' Championship - that was a

tremendous achievement and really ignited the football fire in the parish.

Brian Duggan, Colm O'Brien and Shane Maher were on the Tipperary Minor panel of 1998, as were Shane and Colm again this year. The present panel are all dual players. Jason Seymour, Colm O'Brien, Shane Maher, Cathal Hanrahan, Padraig McDonnell and Patrick Ryan are the backbone of the team while younger players Noel McDonnell, Damien O'Brien and Michael Fogarty show great promise. Noel McDonnell won't be fifteen until late December. Many of the remainder of the panel are still under sixteen.

The Burgess Club is very fortunate in the personnel who are involved, both those who are native to the parish and those who came to live there. They do wonderful work and the club is buzzing. The juvenile section is doing well in hurling and football and the U/21 hurling and Intermediate sides have come through the ranks.

Burgess will be a real force in Tipperary in a few years' time.

FETHARD ARE GOING FOR THEIR 4th COUNTY MINOR TITLE

FETHARD are going for their 4th County Minor title this century and it is a first time against North Tipperary opposition in a County Final.

This is only their fifth time appearing in a County Minor final - losing only one in 1972 -

Arravale Rovers - 1-2 :::: Fethard - 0-2.

Although we had to wait until 1957 to gain our first success it is appropriate that Seamus Hackett, (captain), has a son, Paul on the panel for today's match.

Vincent Allen's second cousin, Ronan is also on the panel. We were successful on

that day -

Fethard 1-7 :::: Arravale Rovers 0-2.

Our second title came in 1985 - Fethard 3-10 :::: Templemore 3-1. Players still playing Senior today are Brian Burke, Willie O'Meara, Willie Morrissey and Chris Coen. His

brother, Brian is also on today's panel.

We won our third title also in the eighties back in 1989 - 10 years ago and still playing Senior today are Michael Spillane, Philip Blake, Martin Ryan and Martin Coen who is another brother of Brian and the score was - Fethard 1-8 :::: Cashel/King Cormacs O-7. Hence, Brian Coen is going for a third County Minor Medal in the one household.

Paul Hackett is going for a fourth as Seamus won in 1957, Dermot was on the 1985 team

and Kenneth played on the 1989 team.

Kenneth Byrne is going for a second as his grandfather, Mick Byrne won a County Medal

with a South Selection in the inaugural year of 1932.

Our captain, Nicholas Murphy, is grandson of the famous Gus McCarthy of "Bloody Sunday" fame back in 1920. Glen Burke, son of Denis Burke; Kenneth Byrne son of Noel Byrne; Ian Kendrick, son of Michael Kendrick; John Fitzgerald, nephew of Davy and John Fitzgerald; Brian Coen, son of Louis Coen, all of who played Senior football with Fethard back in the 1970's / 1980's.

Included is Tommy Gahan, nephew of Davy Morrissey who played around that era; John O'Meara & Carl Maher, first cousins of present players, Willie and Jimmy O'Meara; Conor McCarthy and Kenneth O'Donnell, nephews to Don McCarthy who played for Fethard; Michael Ahearne, son of Mick Aherne, County Board Representative; Philip Croke, son of Eddie Croke and Pat Looby, son of Pat Looby who played the caman with distinction for Fethard.

Also included are John Noonan whose grandfather, Paddy Morrissey, St. Patricks Place; Declan Kenny whose father, Michael was on a Fethard under 21 team member back in 1967 and last but by no means least, Alan Phelan whose uncles played with Moyle Rovers.

COMMERCIALS CARRY PROUD TRADITION INTO COUNTY FINAL

CLONMEL COMMERCIALS take the field today, attempting to win the County Senior Football Championship for the 14th time in the Club's history.

Founded in 1932, Commercials have enjoyed frequent success in all grades of football since.

12 years after their formation, the Club's famous green and gold jerseys had been carried to victory on the playing fields all over Tipperary and had won South and County titles in all grades.

The Club's first taste of County success came in the form of a Minor title in 1935.

A County Junior title followed in 1940 before the first of the Club's 13 Senior titles in 1944.

The captain on that occasion was the legendary, Sean Cleary who went on to captain Commercials in their next two victories in 1948 and 1956.

Arguably the Club's greatest achievement was winning three County titles in a row in 1965, 1966, & 1967.

The captain on all three teams was the late, Brian O'Callaghan.

This is a feat that has not been replicated by any Club since.

The Club's two County titles of the nineties came in 1990 and 1994. On both these occasions, Commercials were beaten in the Munster Club final.

Today, Commercials attempt to bridge a five year gap by winning their 14th County Senior Football final.

Tipp contested the All-Ireland Final that year, unfortunately luck was not with them that day. Team mates included Brian Burke, Derry Foley and Tom Anglim.

Seamus won a Munster and All-Ireland title in 1998. That was a wonderful campaign and Seamus was a key figure in terms of leadership and effective goalkeeping. Seamus is sub goalkeeper to Philly Ryan on the Senior Inter-County side. He had a great year in 1998 when Moyle Rovers reached the Munster Club Championship Final.

He is a useful hurler and won a Co. Junior Championship last year. An all round sportsman, he also plays tennis and golf. Moyle Rovers have ambitious development plans and as Club Chairman, Seamus has a key role in this venture, which will require a huge financial outlay.

MOYLE ROVERS G.A.A. CLUB

Today sees the Moyle Rovers contest their fourth County Senior Football Championship final having competed and been victorious in 1995, 1996 and 1998. Today's final is a unique occasion being the last final of the millennium and a pairing of two neighbouring clubs and naturally great rivals.

Whilst the eighties and nineties have been a memorable period in our club's history such was not always the case. The Moyle Rovers Club was first affiliated in May 1928 and has competed on a regular basis since that time except for a short lapse in the 1950s.

The first success of note was achieved in 1931 when the County Junior Football title was won. This saw our club competing in the Senior Championship in '32, '33 and '34 without success. The present resurgence began in 1956 after a short lapse and over the years the club has progressed steadily to its present day strength.

The County Junior Football Championship was again won in 1959 and the club has competed in the Senior Championship since that date except for one year 1966 when the club was victorious in the South Intermediate Championship.

Much of the success of the various club teams in recent times can be attributed to many great people within our club and parish, but the development of a juvenile section since 1976 and the purchase and development of our own club grounds at Moyle Park, Monroe which was officially opened on May 20, 1990 has been central to this.

The juvenile arm of our club now caters for large numbers of young people which will ensure a strong adult club in hurling and football over the coming years. Since the opening of our club grounds in 1990 a second playing pitch has been added and further development proposals are at an advanced stage to ensure that all our members will be well looked after in the next millennium.

Our successes over the years and the development of our facilities at Monroe are a fitting tribute to the dedicated people who, down the years, under difficult conditions have kept our club to the forefront of G.A.A. affairs in the Premier County.
