Leahy Park, Cashel is the venue for today's intriguing Cidona Tipperary county senior football final between Moyle Rovers and Loughmore-Castleiney. Cashel was also the venue for the 2004 Cidona Tipperary County Under 21 "A" football final on May 16th, when the same two clubs provided a very competitive match before Loughmore edged out winners in the end. On that occasion, many supporters from both clubs would have been content in the knowledge that the future looked bright. As the senior championship has unfolded, the future is now for many of those young players, and at least a handful of those under-21 players will collect a senior medal here today. Six of the Moyle Rovers under-21 team started their semi-final victory over Fethard, while five of the Loughmore under-21 side played against Cahir in their semi-final win. Coincidently, the referee from that under-21 final is also retained – Paddy Russell of Emly.

Of course, both sides have some senior county players to call on as well, which have been influential in their qualification for today's final. The two main players are Micheal Webster and Declan Browne. Micheal Webster has been playing well at midfield for Loughmore while Declan Browne single-handily guided Moyle Rovers to victory over Fethard in the semi-final getting all, except one, of his team's scores. What plans will Loughmore have to restrict the influence of Declan Browne? The success or otherwise of those plans will probably decide this final. It is impossible to entirely restrict the influence of Declan Browne, such are the skills of this outstanding player. We all wish him well over the next two weekends when he will finally get to represent Ireland in the International Rules Series.

Speaking of county players casts one back to the events of the past season. It is unclear how the history books will record what has happened. Perhaps 2004 will be seen as a defining moment for Tipperary football - or something else. None of us know what the long-term future will hold. I sincerely hope that Tipperary football can rebound from this setback and build for the future, starting in the 2005 National League. Hopefully today's final will lay the platform for the future with the winning club today giving the leadership for the 2005 league and championship. Best of luck to both clubs and may the best team win.

LOUGHMORE-CASTLEINEY G.A.A. CLUB BY PAT HEALY, P.R.O.

It is hard to imagine that 1992 was the last year the club brought the county senior football title to the parish.

The convention of 1992 introduced a new method of choosing selectors. A manager was appointed, who picked his own selectors, a system still in operation today. Former club, county and provincial player, Eddie Webster, was the man in charge.

A Mid final victory over the combo side, Oliver Plunketts, followed by success against Lattin-Cullen in the quarter-final, a thrilling semi-final victory over Commercials, following a replay, sent us into the county final against reigning county champions, Fethard. The sides finished level at 0-10 each.

The replay was fixed for Saturday, November 7 at Cashel and, after a fine performance and a superb opportunist goal from Tommy Cullen, we collected our tenth county title, with Seamie Bohan lifting the cup as a result of a 1-9 to 0-10 scoreline, and Tom McGrath winning the Man of the Match award.

Today, thankfully, there are links with that winning side. Declan Laffan, who was then a 17 year-old goalkeeper, Philip and Noel Kennedy, Pat McGrath, Ned Ryan and captain, Seamie Bohan.

One amazing aspect of the 1992 victory was the fact that the club were forced to field in the Munster club championship against Clare champions, Kilkee, on the following day. As well as team manager, Eddie Webster, the selectors were Sean Mockler, Pat Healy, James Maher and Tommy Egan.

The club's last appearance in the county senior football final was in Millennium year 2000. Semple Stadium, Thurles was the venue, and the opposition, as today, Moyle Rovers.

This was one of the best finals for years, with the sides level on various occasions, including injury time, when a Declan Browne kick from out on the end line, hung in front of the goals until a breeze took it over the bar for a 0-10 to 0-9 victory for Moyle Rovers, and heartbreak defeat for our side.

With the great players of the eighties and nineties calling it a day, the club has managed to build a new side and yet keep in contention every year. The winning of the county minor title in 2002, and success in this year's county under-21 A title, aided by some excellent talent in our juvenile teams, the future of the game in the parish looks strong for years to come.

Today's team is captained by Michael Webster, son of Eddie, who was coach and manager of the successful 1992 side.

Moyle Rovers come to Cashel today in search of their sixth county senior football title, and their first since 2000. Having already lost the minor and under-21 finals this year, they will be anxious to atone for these defeats against great rivals, Loughmore-Castleiney.

Though now well established, Moyle Rovers struggled for years to make the breakthrough in senior football. They won their first South senior title in 1991, defeating county champions of that year, Fethard, by a point in the final, the winning score coming from a '45' by Michael John Browne, one of today's selectors.

A second South title was captured in 1995, when they overcame Commercials. They went on to defeat the same opposition in the county final, and take their first title at that level. In goal on that team was their All-Star corner-forward, Declan Browne. Moyle Rovers went on to contest the Munster club final, only to be defeated by Laune Rangers.

This success was the start of the club's dominance of senior football in the county, and they went on to win South and county titles in 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2000. This record of five divisional and county titles in six years is a record to be proud of.

This great success story in the nineties was tinged with sadness, as it saw the death in 2000 of the club's great father figure, Mick McCarthy, often known as Mr. Moyle Rovers. This was followed by the death of the long-serving club president, John Burke, and then in 2003, the club was stunned and saddened by the sudden and untimely death of club secretary, Jimmy McCarthy. These passings were indeed sad but it was fortunate that these men lived to witness the great successes between 1995 and 2000.

Today, the Moyle Rovers club is thriving with huge activities at juvenile level from under-6 to under-16.

The Monroe Development Committee, a sub-committee of the club, have recently completed the construction of a magnificent sports hall, which is proving to be a great amenity within the club and parish.

The Moyle Rovers club is proud to be part of today's final and, whatever the outcome, I'm sure the players will give their all against an opposition with a great hurling and football tradition.

This is Moyle Rovers sixth county football final and they have never been defeated in one! Is this a good omen for today?


