

#### TODAY'S SENIOR GAME REFEREE



Paddy Russell, Emly is the referee for to-day's senior final and is probably the most experienced referee in the county. He started refereeing back in 1976 and has refereed finals in all grades since then. His refereeing career includes schools and interfirm games, as well as club and intercounty.

At the intercounty level he has refereed two senior All-Irelands, in 1990 and 1995. Looking back from the present he regards the Charlie Redmond incident in the latter All-Ireland as the funniest moment in his refereeing career. he was in charge of a minor football All-Ireland

in 1989 and a Railway Cup in 2005. he has also refereed four Munster finals.

He got involved in refereeing very simply. He was asked by his club to attend a juvenile refereeing course in 1976 and the rest is history. He has an interesting comment on the criticism of referees, which is widespread. The best referees are those who never refereed a match of any kind, which is why I take all their critical comments to heart.

Married to Margaret, the couple have two boys, Shane and Mark. Paddy's linesmen today are Brian Tyrell, Clonmel and John O'Brien, Arravale Rovers.

#### COUNTY SENIOR FOOTBALL FINAL PREVIEW BY JACKIE CAHILL OF THE TIPPERARY VOICE

A record 22nd title for Fethard or a sixth for South rivals Moyle Rovers?

All will be revealed this afternoon when the local rivals lock horns for the second time this season – and for the very first time in a county senior football final.

Rovers defeated Fethard in September's South final but the losers had to play much of that game with 14 men and a much tighter affair is predicted at Cashel's resplendent Leahy Park today. Four Moyle Rovers players – former Allstar Declan Browne, Liam Cronin, Robbie Boland and team captain James Williams – are each chasing a sixth county senior medal.

The quartet played key roles in the club's five previous successes in 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2000. Indeed, Browne was goalkeeper on the 1995 team when they made that historic breakthrough and the evergreen Cronin captained the 2000 vintage.

Since their last success seven years ago, Rovers have fallen twice at the final hurdle, beaten by Loughmore-Castleiney in 2004 and Aherlow in 2006. On this very ground 12 months ago, Rovers were demolished by Aherlow on a 2-10 to 0-5 scoreline but the tables were turned last weekend as Declan Browne's late point secured a hard-fought victory for Rovers as the West champions were dethroned.

Fethard, meanwhile, are back in the final for the first time since last winning the competition, against Aherlow in 2001. With 21 titles to their credit, Fethard are far and away the most successful club in the history of the Tipperary senior football championship, with Clonmel Commercials trailing in their wake with fourteen.

Incidentally, today's encounter is the first all-South decider since Moyle Rovers defeated Clonmel Commercials in the 1999 decider. It could be an historic day for Moyle Rovers as their minors prepare to do battle with Arravale Rovers at 1.15pm, an attractive curtain-raiser to what promises to be an intense senior game. (3.0pm) Two senior panellists – Kieran Kenrick and Tipperary's All-Ireland minor hurling medallist Seán Carey – will line out for the minors but it is highly unlikely that either player will be asked to play a part in the senior game which follows.

Fethard, meanwhile, have regrouped well after losing the South final and their comprehensive 3-9 to 0-7 semi-final victory over Thomas McDonaghs was a vast improvement on previous outings. And so the scene is set. Will it be a seasonal championship double for Rovers against their divisional rivals, or sweet revenge for Fethard? Sixty minutes will tell all. *Enjoy the game*.

#### FETHARD GAA CLUB

Today sees the very first meeting of Fethard and Moyle Rovers in a county final. Fethard have appeared in 31 finals, winning 21. It has been six years since our last victory at Thurles, Fethard 1-13 Aherlow 0-8. Our last defeat in a county final was back in 1992 in a replay, Loughhmore 1-9 Fethard 010. The team of 2001 went all the way to a Munster Club final losing out to Nemo Rangers 1-11 to 0-10. Today four of that team Ml Quinlan, Tom Anglim, Brian Burke and Tommy Sheeahan, are not available for selection. The remaining eleven players, plus two of the subs, as well as Benny Hahessy and Jamie McCormack make up today's fifteen.

Fethard are bidding for their 22th county senior title. In the eighties we produced a new core of players Brian Burke, Tommy Sheehan, the Hackett brothers John and Dermot, the O'Mearas, Willie and Jimmy, the Coens, Coos Shay and Martin, some others retired with those still playing today at top level Willie Morrissey and Miceal Spillane. We started winning county titles in Centenary Year and continued in 1988, 1991, 1993, 1997. New names were added to the squad in the mid nineties, Paul Fitzgerald, Damien Byme, Stephen 0 Donnell, to be further strengthened by John P Looby and Aiden Fitzgerald adding titles in 1997,2001 before the emergence of Glen Burke, MI Aheme, Kenneth 0 Donnell, Conor McCarthy, Ian Kendrick, Cian Maher, Eoin Doyle, Jamie McCormack, Brian Coen, Shane Walsh, from the successful 3 in a row county under 21A titles, 2000,2001,2002. All of this talent together with the emerging talent of this year's under-18 panel have been available to the management team.

Our success in recent years commenced with the minor and junior a titles in 1999, with our last senior county success in 2001 our under-21 titles, to our most recent success in 2006 with the intermediate hurlers winning the South and our junior A football win in 2003, Many of our players have represented the county in the last few years most notably our representation on the Tommy Murphy success of 2005 Paul and Aiden Fitzgerald and Damien Byrne with the previous All-Ireland success of the juniors in 1998 when we also had three, Willie Morrissey, Damien Byrne, and Tommy Sheehan. In the last year our sole representative in senior football was Cian Maher, with Aiden Fitzgerald on the intermediate hurling,

The juvenile club are doing great work and this year we won the South under-14A hurling, a competition we had not won for 25 years and we wish them all the best in the future in the maintaining the high standards set by their predecesors.

#### CHAMPIONS OF 1968 & 1972 HONOURED

In keeping with the practice of the past number of years, the Tipperary county board, in conjunction with the Nationalist and the Park Hotel, Clonmel honour the county senior football champions of 1968 and 1972, Kilsheelan/Kilcash, at the county senior football final at Leahy Park, Cashel today. The members of the two victorious sides will be given a reception, sponsored by the county board, when they arrive at Leahy Park. After the match they will be taken to the Park Hotel for dinner. During the meal they will be made a presentation by the Nationalist. The occasion should be a great opportunity for the members of the two panels to reminisce about their great exploits on the field of play nearly forty years ago.

#### When Kilsheelan Were Champions

The years 1968 and 1972 are probably the most famous years in the history of Kilsheelan/Kilcash club. In these two years they doubled their number of senior football championships, having won two previously in 1930 and 1933.

There wasn't much to presage the arrival of Kilsheelan on the senior football scene in 1968. Ardfinnan and Clonmel Commercials had dominated the scene for most of the sixties and were to continue to do so for some years after that.

Maybe the catalyst was the decision taken at the county convention to introduce the Open Draw in the senior football championship. Proposed by Clonmel Commercials, it was passed by a substantial majority with the provision that it be for a one-year trial period. It was to bring a change in the fortunes of the Kilsheelan club.

The new look championship got under way at Cashel on April 14, with eight teams from the South, four from the West, four from the Mid and one from the North competing. Kilsheelan made good progress and qualified for the semi-final in which they defeated Moyle Rovers by 1-4 to 1-2 at Clonmel on October 20. In the second semi-final Ardfinnan defeated Fethard by 2-5 to 1-7 at the same venue two weeks later.

The final was played at Clonmel on November 17 and the result was a surprise. Kilsheelan won their first senior title since 1933 when they defeated Ardfinnan, who were odd-on favourites and South Division titleholders, by 1-11 to 2-7. It was one of the best county finals for years. Kilsheelan led by 1-7 to 0-3 at half-time but with less that six minutes remaining, they were a point behind and Ardfinnan were looking certain winners. But Kilsheelan didn't give up and scored two points to give them an unexpected victory.

The successful team was as follows: Johnny Dempsey, Johnny O'Driscoll, Johnny O'Halloran, Frank Coffey, Mick Morrissey, Martin O'Gorman, Richard O'Gorman, Jonathon Moriarity, Donie Fitzpatrick, Dick Strang, Liam Larkin, Sean Nugent, Cyril Robinson, Willie Robinson (capt.), Philly O'Halloran. The panel also included Patsy O'Halloran, Jim Morrissey, John Donovan, George Power, Jim Cahill, Willie Marshall, Jim Holohan and Jim Kehoe.

The county champions were beaten by East Kerry, 1-12 to 0-3, in the first round of the Munster club championship at Kilsheelan a week later.

The Open Draw proved popular and was still there in 1972 when Kilsheelan won their fourth county senior football final, and their last to date. After the success of 1968, Kilsheelan lost out to Ardfinnan, in a match in which Babs Keating got two goals, in the 1969 semi-final. In 1970 they made their exit in the first round, going down to Eire Óg, Annacarty, and the same happened in 1971, when they went out to Loughmore-Castleiney.

There was a determination in the club in 1972 to avoid the disastrous results of the previous two years and build on the success of 1968. Twenty teams took part in the county championship and Kilsheelan

defeated Aherlow and Moyle Rovers along the way to qualify for the semi-final. Four teams from the South qualified for the penultimate stage and the semi-finals were played at Clonmel on October 8. Kilsheelan got the better of Fethard by 0-7 to 0-4, while Ardfinnan defeated Commercials by 0-8 to 1-4.

The final, a repeat of the 1968 decider, was played at Clonmel on October 22. Much was expected of the encounter but, generally, the game was disappointing and the occasion lacked atmosphere. The game was close but Kilsheelan deserved their two-point victory on a scoreline of 1-11 to 1-9. Ardfinnan suffered from injuries and never looked capable of wining. It was Kilsheelan's fourth title and Jim Kehoe was their outstanding player with a personal tally of 1-5.

The successful team was as follows: Johnny Dempsey, Johnny O'Driscoll, Johnny O'Halloran, Mick Morrissey, Jim Cahill, Martin O'Gorman, Richard O'Gorman, Jonathon Moriarity, Richard Strang, Liam Murphy, Jim Kehoe, Cyril Robinson, Philly O'Halloran, Jim Holohan, Sean Nugent. The panel also included Liam Larkin, Willie Robinson, Sean Connolly, Pat Keyes, Pat Larkin, Tommy Ryan, Declan Geoghegan, Tommy Lonergan, Patsy O'Halloran, Gerry Hennebry, Michael Dempsey.

The county champions were beaten in the first round of the Munster club championship. They lost by 0-11 to 1-5 to Clare champions, Doonbeg, at Kilsheelan on March 4, 1973.

Why did Kilsheelan/Kilcash make the breakthrough in 1968 after many years of trying since their previous victory in 1933? One of the members of the team, Richard O'Gorman, gave this reason in a contribution to the club history, which was published in 1988:

'Everybody knows that 'tradition' plays a major role in all championship successes, whether they be club or county. Kilsheelan had many fine teams between 1933 and 1968 but still failed to win a senior championship. The breakthrough came in 1968 and for me this came about in the team's preparation for the final. The Rosminian Order of priests were based at Glencomeragh and had among them many who had played football with their counties at various levels. They had a very fast and skillful team and challenge games were arranged with them in preparation for the final. Being a religious order, Kilsheelan were obliged to avoid the 'stopping' type tactics, which were generally used against other teams. As a result we were unable to cope with the skill and free-flowing football played by the Rosminians and it was customary in the early games to be beaten by anything up to 15 points. However, we were learning with each game and by our final game we had almost come to grips with them. We had eliminated many of our weaknesses and had sharpened our game considerably and with Tom Larkin sparing no effort we were prepared for the success few players or supporters thought possible. The Rosminians had initiated the success of 1968 from which so many fine displays came in the following years.'

Richard continues: 'On the field of play Kilsheelan's greatest 'strength' was in its balance throughout the field. The team was physically strong with no place for the shy, fancy player. We had a very reliable goalkeeper backed by strong, tight, marking and, at all times, fearless defenders, who took any risk to prevent a score. To most of our opponents we never appeared on paper to have a very strong midfield, yet I can safely say that as far as I can remember our main player in that area never had a bad game and our forwards never had to accept less than fifty percent of ball from midfield. We were lucky to have had a forward line, all of whom were capable of scoring. All six forwards generally scored and we never lacked for a first-rate free taker. Overall it was a well-balanced and skillful team backed up by a willingness to train and to be mentally prepared for the big day.'

What more needs to be said about this band of players, who brought two county senior titles to the club in 1968 and 1972. They deserve to be remembered today and forever.

#### Kilsheelan/Kilcash Panel Members in 1968 and 1972

Johnny Dempsey: Was a very capable goalkeeper, played in both finals and also represented his county in the u-21 grade.

In the right fullback line was the teak tough uncompromising Johnny O'Driscoll, whose long relieving clearances were a feature.

Next to him on each occasion was the high-fielding and very reliable Johnny O'Halloran now deceased. Representing him today is his son, Aidan.

In the other corner was the fiercely determined Frank Coffey. In the '1968 final he held Michael "Babs" Keating to one point.

Right half back was the tight-marking and tough as nails Mick Morrissey, who rarely put a foot wrong.

Centre half back was a man who had a great pair of hands under the dropping ball and represented his county at underage level - Martin O'Gorman.

On his left was his brother Dick O'Gorman. Another safe pair of hands, his long-distance clearances were a feature of his play and he played many times for the county team.

This player won his place in the team of 1972. A very reliable defender whose speed off the mark was a feature. His name is - Jim Cahill.

At midfield was a man with Kerry blood in his veins. Although quietly spoken he said it all on the field - Jonathon Moriarty.

Also at midfield in the 1968 final was another exponent of all the skills of the game, Donie Fitzpatrick.

Moving to attack we have the captain of the 1972 team, who also represented his county many times with distinction - the outstanding Dick Strang.

In the centre was a name very synonymous with the club. His accuracy from frees in the 1968 final played a big part in the victory - Liam Larkin.

On the other wing was a very loyal servant, who later turned to administration. Former chairman of the South Board and currently board secretary, Sean Nugent.

Moving to the inside line we had Cyril Robinson, a player who gave outstanding service and also lined out for the county at underage. Unfortunately he is now deceased and representing him here today is his son, Keith.

At full forward was the man who got the goal in the 1968 decider and also represented the county many times. He was later a prominent referee - William Robinson.

Completing the line up in 1968 was the man, who put Kilsheelan in front in the closing stages and played no small part in this famous win, Philly O'Halloran. He is also deceased and represented by his son Senan.

In 1972, the selectors took the opportunity to give youth its fling. A talented performer scoring 1-5 in the final and went on to play for his county in both codes. His name was Jim Kehoe.

Also on board was another up and coming player who was not shy of the goal-posts when the chance came his way. His name is Liam Murphy.

Lined out at full forward that day was James Holohan. Better known for his general input in the club and is currently the secretary.

In the earlier rounds of the '68 championship and in preceding years John Donovan was ever present on the side. He was also on the 1964 team that took junior football honours.

This player lined out with Tipperary minors in the All-Ireland final of 1955 and had an outstanding career with his native Fethard before coming to Kilsheelan - Sean Connolly.

He was a member of the 1964 side and a tireless loyal servant in an attacking role, Jim Morrissey.

One of the fastest players off the mark was a regular on the sides in those years and probably better

known as a hurler - the late Pat Keyes. Representing him today is his son PJ.

On the subs bench in 1972 was Pat Larkin whose best years were ahead of him and he was an outstanding full-back and also represented his county.

Also a sub that year, he was a regular in attack and played in the Munster Club championship the following year - Tommy Ryan.

This player also played in attack and played in the Munster Club championship already mentioned - Declan Geoghegan.

On the panel in 1972 was a man who went on to give great service as goalkeeper, later as an intercounty referee and is a selector with this year's team - Tommy Lonergan.

Another very loyal servant. His enthusiasm for the game ensured he rarely missed a training session. For 23 years he served as secretary of South Bord na nÓg, Patsy O'Halloran.

Another panellist who gave lots of service to the club and later served as chairman of the juvenile club - Gerry Henebry.

Also from the class of 1968 and who played most of his football at junior level was Willie Marshall. Now deceased he is represented by his son Liam.

We started with a Dempsey and we are going to finish up with a Dempsey. This player was a regular on the senior team - his name Michael Dempsey.

Selectors: Selectors on both occasions were the same. Johnny Kehoe, who helped the club to senior titles in 1930 and 1932, was also club chairman at the time. Now deceased he is represented by a family member. Also a selector was Billy Stokes. He was a very talented goalkeeper on the hurling teams in his playing days. He served as chairman of the Club for nine years. Trainer was Tom Larkin. He played at full back in the 1964 team when they won the junior football title. He also played for the county in both codes and will be remembered as the only Kilsheelan player to win an All-Ireland senior hurling medal.
