

Whereas the senior game is an all-south affair, in which Commercials and Moyle Rovers fight for honours, the minor final brings into opposition Newport, the champions of the north division and Golden-Kilfeacle, the champions of the west.

Tipperary football has a new bounce in its step as a result of significant successes during 1995. For a county starved of footballing glory, the victories of the senior team in the All-Ireland 'B' championship and the minors in the Munster final were most welcome. These successes were tremendously important in themselves but they should also have the effect of increasing the county's belief in its footballing potential. With such self-belief greater success can be achieved as Clare proved in winning the All-Ireland senior hurling championship.

This year we celebrate the centenary year of Tipperary's great achievement in winning the football and hurling All Irelands of 1895. In that year the famed Arravale Rovers Team, about whom Tom O'Donoghue has written so well in his recently launched history of the Arravale Rovers club, won the first leg of the double when they beat Navan O'Mahony's. The hurling leg was won by glorious Tubberadora, who were recently commemorated in an impressive monument in the parish of Boherlahan. Both these matches were played in Jones's Road now Croke Park, on the same day and were the first All-Irelands to be played in that yenue.

Today, therefore, as we gather in Cahir for the senior and minor county football finals, we can take pleasure in recalling the high achievements of Tipperary football in 1995 and the glorious memories of one hundred years ago.

Finally, I should like to thank the Cahir club for hosting today's games, the referees and match officials who are in charge and the Communications Committee for the production of this program. I should like to thank all our supporters and wish them an afternoon of good football.

Keen on keeping fit, Tom has run thirteen marathons and has already started his training programme for the 100th. Boston Marathon next April. His other interest is Irish traditional music and is a member of the renowned Bru Boru group.

His Umpires today are Nicholas Lonergan, Michael Forrester, Noel Fitggerald and Liam O'Dwyer. His linesmen are Paddy Russell and Eamon O'Dwyer.

FRAN O'LEARY (ARDFINNAN)

This year makes it a very special occasion as we welcome Moyle Rovers who contest their first football final and also to our current and worthy champions Clonmel Commercials.





Five of today's side were in action then: John O'Toole and Tom Clifford still hold the same positions; Aidan O'Gorman and Eoin Bonfield manned the corners of the defence; Kenneth O'Brien was at corner-forward. Brian Coffey and Paddy Ryan were also on the panel.

Newport are assisted by Ballinahinch in this year's minor championship. Their representatives on the panel are David Fahy, Cathal Bourke, Michael Carrol, Mark Walton, Des Kelly and William Lynch.

In 1971 Newport-Ballinahinch won the north Tipperary minor football title, Defeating Kilruane by 1-3 to 0-5 in the final,

A Newport team won the first north Tipperary minor football championship. The year was 1940, when Kyle brought the honour to the parish, defeating Nenagh in a replay. During the game play had to be delayed for ten minutes while the ball was being retrieved from the top of a nearby tree.

GREAT GAMES IN PROSPECT

Cahir hosts the county final between two South Tipperary teams, Clonmel Commercials county champions 1994 and Moyle Rovers 1995 south champions.

The year 1995 has been a very good year for Tipperary football with the minors reaching All-Ireland semi final only to be beaten by eventual champions Westmeath. The under 21 side defeated Cork in the first round only to fall to Waterford in the next round. The juniors travelled to Tralee and a failure to take their chances proved very costly as Kerry won by Five points and also won the Munster Title.

At Juvenile livel county titles are now shared by the Four divisions and already this year Inane Rovers have won county minor 'B' title with Borrisoleigh winning county under 16 title. Ardfinan won county under 16 title after an outstanding game of football with Arravale Rovers enjoyed by a huge crowd in New Inn. Burgess created their own piece of history in winning county honours at under 12 level while Fethard proved champions in the under 14 grade with a very good side...

1995 Saw Tipperary win all Ireland 'B' title at Senior level with Billy Ryan, Fergall O'Callaghan and Kieran O'Reilly of Clonmel Commercials and Derry Foley and Liam Cronin of Moyle Rovers.


Both Commercials and Moyle Rovers are steeped in football tradition and every year Clonmel commercials are considered as one tf the sides to be Beaten at Senior level. Moyle Rovers have found it very hard to come out of the south Division despite the fact that they have given many players to the County Teams. The Present Team contains Derry Foley, John Owens and Liam Cronin of the Senior sides and Declan Brown, Corner forward on Minor side but Goalkeeper on Club Senior Side and also Brendan O'Dwyer wing Back on county team. Donal Foley, Elder Brother of Derry, was on Tipperary Senior side for many years while Jimmy Dunne was on Tipperary Senior team for many years and is also a very good hurler. John McGrath, Michael McGrath, Seamus Delahunty have also worn Tipperary Blue and Gold with Distiction.

Clonmel Commercials feature a side who have all played with Tipperary in some grades. Goalie Philly Ryan has been county captain this year and is a great characteron and off the field. Benny Walsh was centre back on county minor side while Cristoir McGrath was full forward on Sounty Senior Side and Absent from the side when they played Moyle Rovers in South Final, Also absent onthat date were Rian Furrestal and star full forward Franny Kelly who gave such excellent survice to Tipperary at Minor under 21, Junior and senior level. Franny Kelly is now manager of Waterford Senior Football side.

Both of these sides play a good open style of football and hopefully we will have a game to remember and the winning side will give us a captain to lead Tipperary to further honours in 1996.

The minor game is a real novel final between Newport winners over Cahir in the county semi final and Golden -Kilfeacle who overcame Kickame-Rahealty in their semi final, Aidan O'Gorman of Newport and David Fogarty of Golden -Kilfeacle were members of county minor side and were also members of County minor hurling side. Golden-kilfeacle have already won County nder 21 'B' football title defeating Cahir in the decider and many of these players will be playing on Sundy.

FRANNIE KELLY (CLONMEL COMMERCIALS)

When Frannie Kelly leads out Clonmel Commercials today he will not be awed by the occasion. At 33, he is looked upon as the 'Daddy' of the squad and he is playing in his 12th county final. He won the first of his five county championships in 1982 when many of his team-mates today were in short trousers and he captained his first team in a county final in 1984

Since 1974 when he began his career as an under-12 he has won honours in every grade with Commercials. He played minor, U-21 and senior for Tipperary in 1980 and was a regular with the county senior team for many years.

Beginning in 1985 when he joined 13 kerrymen on the Munster Railway cup team, he represented Munster again in '86, '87, '91 and '92. For two years running he was the highest scorer in the National Football league, beating Dublin's Barney Rock into second place. During this period he was listed by Eugene McGee among playes who, according to the then-Offaly coach, were deserving of selection to the All-Stars but were "condemned to

exterior darkness by the lack of success of their county team."

In 1990 he won the Cidona Footballer of the Year award, having won the Man of the Match award in the county final. And having won the Man fo the Match award for his eight points in the great Tipp victory over All-Ireland champions Down in 1992, he went out a week later and scored 1-4 for Munster against Leinster.

As a hurler too he has won many honours with St. Mary's which he has captained in every grade from under-12 up. In 1980 he was a sub on the Tipp, minor team which beat Wexford

in the All-Ireland final and in the same year he won South Tipp's Hurler of the Year Award.



His involvement in games in never ending, he is chairman of Commercials juvenile club and coaches all the clubs teams from under-8's upwards.

His services as a coach are in wide demand outside the county and at present he is in charge of the Waterford team facing into the National League. He is also coach to the Kilrossanty team which will be playing next Sunday in waterford's county final. Should Commercials win today and Kilrossanty win next Sunday, Franny Kelly could find himself in the Munster club championship captaining his own team and coaching his opponents!!!

DERRY FOLEY

Derry was born on 3rd. July 1967. He is the youngest son of the late Dan Foley R.I.P. of Garryroe, Clonmel and Breda nee McGrath of Powerstown, Clonmel.

Derry who stands at 6'4" in height is a farmer by occupation on the home farm at Garryroe.

He attended the national school in Rathkeevan, Clonmel High School, St. Colemans in Fermoy and U.C.C.

His interestin Gaelic games was initially developed at home being from a family whose roots are deeply etched in the G.A.A. He first represented the Moyle Rovers club at the age of nine playing centre field in the under "12" championship losing to Fethard in the South semi-final that year. He has been a loyal servant to our

club since that time playing at all levels except for a period of four years which he spent in America.

Derry holds a South and County minor football championship medal with Slicvenamon in 1984, two south senior football championship medals 1991, 1995, two Clonmel Oil senior football league medals '92, '93, a Tipperary man cup medal in 1993 and an All-Ireland B Champioonship medal this year. He also won a Dean Ryan under 16 and a half medal with St. Colemans and South Tipperary hurling Championship B medal with Moyle Rovers in 1993.

He has represented Tipperary at minor level and has been ever present on the Tipperary senior football team in recent years.



ALL-IRELAND 'B' CHAMPIONS 1995

Tipperary senior footballers made history on August 27th when they defeated longford by seven points in the All-Ireland 'B' championship at Birr. The win was most welcome for football followers in the county after the poor National League Campaign and the heavy defeat by Kerry in the Munster Championship. Unfortunately, the game got little publicity and the attendance of less than one thousand people on a Sunday evening hardly did justice to the endeavour of the players and the significance of the win.

An indication of the significance of this win is the fact that it's the first major win in county senior football since 1971. in that year Tipperary won Division 2 of the National Football league and were presented with a special trophy by the President of the Association, Pat Fanning. The team achieved a one hundred percent record on their way to success, defeating Carlow, Limerick, Waterford, Wexford, Clare and

Kilkenny along the way.

Victory was clinched when they defeated Waterford by 0-10 to 1-6 at Clonmel on May 16th. Babs Keating, the captain, punched a point five minutes from the end to give the team a pont victory. The victorious side was J. O'Donoghue, J.Harney, E.Webster, M.McCormack, D.Fitzgerald, D.O'Gorman, P.O'Donoghue, D.Burke, S.Kearney, P.Blythe, M.Keating, P.O'Connell, J.Cummins, D.Strang, C.McElwee. Subs: P.Moroney for Fitszerald, L.Myles for McElwee. The selectors were Mick Frawley of Emly, Rev. Dr. Marsh of Ardfinnan, Michael O'Meara of Clonmel, Dick McGrath of Loughmore-Castleiney and Tom Larkin of Kilsheelan.

But Back to '95. Having beaten Wexford and Waterford, Tipperary qualified for the All-Ireland 'B' final. The victory over Wexford was of particular importance as it represented a tremendours bounce back after the championship defeat by Kerry. It was Longford's second appearance in the final, having lost to Clare in the 1991

decider.

There was never any doubt about the outcome. Longord had no answer to Tipperary, whose appetite for the fray and technical ability were far superior. Playing with the breeze in the first half they established an eight point lead, 1-7 to 0-2, after eleven minutes. Derry Foley was in inspirational form at cetrefield while Sean Brett and Tom Macken were on top in defence. Davy Hogan scored the first half goal while substitute, Mark Leonard, got the second. Longford notched 1-3 in the last ten minutes but there was never any doubt about the outcome. The final

score was 2-12 to 2-5 in favour of Tipperary

ARRAVALE ROVERS ALL-IRELAND CHAMPIONS 1895

The Arravale Rovers club, representing Tipperary, won the 1895 All-Ireland senior football final, when they beat Navan O'Mahony's of Meath. However, if it were one hundred years later, the club might never have got the opportunity to represent the county.

One can take up the story in the county semi-final of 1895, played on October 27th at Deerpark, Carrick-on-Suir between the Tipperary town club and Grangemockler. Twenty minutes before the end of the game Grangemockler were awarded a free and Arravale disagreed so much with the verdict they walked off the field! When the matter was discussed at the county council of the Tipperary G.A.A. early in December it was decided that the final twenty minutes of the game be played in Cashel on December 22nd after which the winners would play the county final against Loughmore.

Grangemockler refused to abide by the decision and the matter came before the Central Council of the Association in January 1896. The decision of the county council of the Tipperary G.A.A. was upheld and the match fixed for Cashel on February 3. Grangemockler refused to field and Arravale had a facile victory over loughmore by 4-6 to 0-1 to become county champions.


As champions of county Tipperary, Arrravale's next game was against Waterford in the Munster championship. They beat them by 2-7 to 0-1 at Tipperary on February 1 and went on to beat Limerick Commercials by 0-5 to 0-2 in the final at Kilmallock on February 23. Entry to the pitch cost three pence. Playing for Limerick on that occasion was Willie Quane, a brother of Robert, who was a star on the Arravale side.

This victory qualified the Tipperary side for the All-Ireland. It was fixed for Jones's Road on March 15 and was played in conjunction with the hurling All-Ireland. Admission charges for the day were six pence to the track around the pitch and twelve pence for a stand seat. these were pre-booked prices. Those who bought their tickets on the paid double the prices.

Arravale wore white jerseys and togs while Navan O'Mahony's were in crimson jerseys and green togs. The day was wet and windy and the Meath side, having won the toss, decided to play with the wind. They made good use of it and led by three points to nil at halftime. Arravale began to peg back the lead in the second half and with ten minutes remaining the sides were level. Three minutes later Arravale Rovers got the crucial score, when Willie Ryan sent over the bar to put the Tipperary side a point in front. Apart from the point Ryan had a fine game and was regarded as the star of the side. The final score was Arravale Rovers 0-4: Navan O'Mahony's 0-3.

However, the result was in doubt as a result of a letter to the newpaper the following day by the referee, J.J Kenny of Dublin. According to him Tipperary's second point was illegal because the player wasn't outside the twenty-one yard line when the ball was kicked out. The letter was read out at the next central council meeting but it was decided to uphold the referees decision on the pitch. the council decided, because of Navan's good sportsmanship in not pursuing Mr. kenny's claims, to put up a special set of silver medals, for a return bout between Rovers and the O'Mahony's.
