

The present year has been an extraordinary year for Seamus. First he became chairman of our club in January. He then went on to win Munster and All-Ireland medals with the Tipperary Junior footballers. Two nights after winning the All-Ireland final he lined out for our club to win the South Senior football title. He was also a member of the Tipperary Senior football panel that was defeated by Kerry in this year's Munster Final. Seamus has also coached underage teams in our club to championship success in recent years.

Moyle Rovers are deeply appreciative of Seamus's commitment to the club both on and off the playing field and look forward to his involvement for many years to come. Victory today for our club would surely round-off an outstanding year for him.


