

In 1912 the Boherlahan club was born out of the ashes of three local clubs who in earlier years had won county hurling final honours: Tubberadora - 1895,1896, 1889: Suir View 1897 and Ballytarsna 1901. The early years of the new Boherlahan club often referred to as the Leahy era, were outstandingly successful and between 1912 and 1928 they won no less than nine county finals and two All Irelands 1916 and 1925. After a slack period in the thirties Boherlahan were back once again in 1941 under the captaincy of the late Philly O'Dwyer to capture Mid honours from Thurles Sarsfields and the county title from Eire Og, Anacarty. Defeated in the Mid finals of 1948 by Holycross and 1949 by Borrisoleigh they again took the Mid title in 1953 against Thurles Sarsfields but lost the county final to Borrisoleigh. The 1953 divisional success of forty two years ago was in fact Boherlahan's last Mid final appearance until the present year.

Having little success throughout the remainder of the fifties a parish senior team from Boherlahan. Suir View and Dualla contested the 1959 and 1960 senior championships but in 1961 the club regraded junior under the name Boherlahan-Dualla. The next two decades brought little success except for a minor county final in 1970 but eventually we won the Intermediate county final in 1981 and returned once more to senior status. Cahill cup successes followed in 1983 and 1993 and this year sees us back in the Mid final once more having defeated Holycross-Ballycahill, Gortnahoe and Thurles Sarsfields on the way. Over recent weeks the team has been training assiduously under Aengus Ryan, Cashel. who incidentally was also in charge for the 1983 Cahill Cup victory; Martin O'Dwyer, a charismatic manager, Ciaran Maher and Willie Jo O'Dwyer, Though Loughmore will no doubt line up as firm favourites we have high hopes that this young Boherlahan team, a number of whom have graduated from the successful 1993 minor team will eventually succeed in getting our parish back to the position it once proudly held as champions of Tipperary and wouldn't it be appropriate if success should coincide with the centenary celebrations currently under way in the club commemorating Tubberadora's rise to fame a hundred years ago in 1895. Having already won the senior football they are bidding to be dual champions for the sixth time. Frank McGrath, Pat McGrath, Tom McGrath, Michael McGrath, Eamon Brennan, Pat Treacy and Eamon Sweeney were members of the 1981 team that contested their first ever senior final losing to Moycarkey.


