

thurles Sarsfields captain Brendan Carroll has epitomised the kind of spirit that is necessary in the field of sport with his dedication to the Blues down through the years. That was never more evident than in the current season when, despite the huge obstacles placed before him, he is still managing to play a central role in Sarsfields campaign.

The former country star is currently working in Scotland but his commitment to the club and to the game of hurling brings him home each and every weekend so that he can hone his skills and prepare for the Mid Final. For many other players, this kind of commitment would be just too great – not for Carroll though who was on the Sarsfields teams which won

Mid titles in 1993 and 1996.

Brendan played minor and u-21 for Tipperary and progressed onto the senior squad as well. His experience has been vital to Sarsfields this year, especially considering the introduction of new, younger blood into the squad. As if his playing commitments were not enough, Brendan was also Manager of the clubs u-21 team which lost the Mid Final to Drom/Inch a short time ago. His contribution to the game of hurling in the club is huge.

A very successful underage player with Durlas Og, winning county u-12, u-14 and u-16 titles in both codes, Brendan is not just a player of the small ball. He played an integral part in the clubs intermediate football campaign last year – the team were beaten in the County semi-final by Carrick Swans and he is once again involved in the football setup in the club this time round.

Brother of goalkeeper Ciaran, Brendan comes from good hurling stock – the late and great Ted Carroll (Kilkenny hurler and official) was his uncle, while Brendan's father Mick also hurled for Kilkenny.

Whatever the outcome of this evening's game, Brendan Carroll can feel a real sense of achievement by just being on the Sarsfields side in Semple Stadium. His desire for success dictates that just being there will not be enough for him. He wants to be on the winners podium after the final whistle.

PLAYER PROFILE

t the 1907 County Convention it was agreed to have three divisions in the county with the new division - Mid - operating from Thurles, Clubs affiliated were Thurles, Movcarkey, Two-Mile-Templetuohy. Gurteen Borris. Upperchurch, Milestone, Drombane, Clonoulty, Rossmore. Holycross. Cappawhite, Cashel and Racecourse.

Officials appointed were: John Cahill, Cashel (Chairman); Andy Mason (Secretary) and Mikie Maher

Tubberadora (Treasurer).

No games were played in 1907 as the Secretary proposed that the medals be awarded to Thurles. The proposal was accepted by the newly formed board.

ith the exceptions of 1927 and when Clonoulty and Castleiney - Killea respectively won the championship all finals from 1907 to 1947 were won by teams from Thurles, Moycarkey-Borris and Boherlahan, Holycross-Ballycahill had their first win in 1947. Borrisoleigh in 1949: Movne-Templetuohy in 1970; Drom-Inch 1974 and Loughmore Castleinev in 1983.

ight teams entered for the 1908 championship with the draw as follows: Thurles v Templetuohy; Cappawhite v Two-Mile-Borris; Holycross v Rossmore; Cashel v Horse and Jockey. In the semi-finals Thurles defeated Two-Mile-Borris and Holycross won against Cashel. Cashel objected to Holycross, who had joined forces with Drombane. The objection was upheld but Cashel suffered a heavy defeat in the final, played in

Rossmore, when Thurles won on the score 2-12 to 0-3. Two teams affiliated for football – Thurles and Templemore. Their game was fixed for Two-Mile-Borris. Templemore refused

The Mid Division Through the Decades

The Mid Board appears to have been somewhat disorganised in 1923. Three games were fixed for Holycross on one Sunday. T. Ryan (Lanigan), Borrisoleigh cycled from Borrisoleigh to referee all the games but all three resulted in walkovers. Mr Ryan was not amused.

n 1918 the Mid Final was played in Dwyer's field, Skeard, Holycross. Boherlahan defeated Thurles by 6-2 to 4-2. The games was refereed by J. Abbeyleix – staying overnight in Thurles.

have seen many Mid Finals but I am certain that the best final I have seen was the drawn game between Borrisoleigh and Boherlahan in 1949. Hurling fever had gripped the county as Tipperary had won the Minor and Senior All-Ireland finals two weeks previously. It is estimated that close on 8,000 attended the game.

Boherlahan led by five points after fifteen minutes but Borrisoleigh scored five points without reply to lead 0-7 to 2-0 at half time. Boherlahan dominated the first quarter of the second half to take a three point lead but Borris levelled with ten minutes remaining. Five minutes from full time Borris goaled but Boherlahan had the last word through a Sonny Maher goal.

Final score: Boherlahan 4-1, Borris-Ileigh 1-10.

There were some fine passages of

play especially a three minute period when the ball travelled from end to end without going out of play.

ollowing a County Final victory in Intermediate Hurling over Kiladangan in 1980 at Semple Stadium the club had gained a new status by entering the Senior Ranks. In their first year they contested the mid Final and suffered defeat, this was repeated in 1982. Contesting a third in a row in 1983 one felt that there were no honours for losers and with a powerful display in Templemore Sportsfield on a sweltering August Sunday Rd Stapleton lifted the Leahy cup in victory over our previous two year victors Moycarkey Borris.

The County Final was reached and with a fine display we lost out to Borrisoleigh 0-17 to 1-11. Following mid title victories in 1986 and 1987, the club reached their second county final but lost by one point to Cappawhite 1-17 to 2-13, certainly a huge disappointment. Not to be denied a County title in the decade of senior status, the same bunch of players regrouped when the campaign of '88 began. A third mid title in-a-row was won and fine victories in Co. Quarter and Semi-Finals put us in the County final, where amends for '87 was certainly the motto. Borrisoleigh were the opposition and after a replay the dreams were realised when Eamon Sweeney lifted the Dan Breen Cup on a damp November evening to return to the villages of Loughmore and Castleiney. Many links remain this evening with that 1980 Intermediate victory, Tom, Michael and Frankie McGrath are panel members, Eamon Sweeney and Pat Gleeson

are selectors, Injured goalkeeper Tim Cullens father, Pat was a mentor,

County finals in minor hurling and U-21 (B) hurling have also been won. Many players from the club have represented the county in various grades. Pat McGrath was captain of the county senior hurlers defeated in the league final of 1989.

Three of this evening's team were members of the county senior hurling team this year, David Kennedy, Paul Ormonde and Noel Morris.

Martin Gleeson was a member of the County Minor Hurling team. Tommy Ormonde was a member of the County Junior Football team.

It must also be remembered that all the achievements on the hurling scene were matched by our football teams winning County and Divisional titles on various occasions.

Perhaps the unique thing about the club down the years of success is that almost every player is a dual performer, and with the demands on the players of today this can make things difficult in many ways.



Hats Off to the Big Three The Doyles, and Reddan

uring the second half of the nineteenth century the national games were threatened with extinction. In stepped the Gaelic Athletic Association to save the day and the fruits of their labours in 1884 was the foundation of the most powerful amateur organisation in the world. Down through the decades Gaelic Games have become increasingly popular, and the GAA has made a unique contribution to the social, and indeed economic life of this country.

Tipperary is justly proud of its close and active connection with the foundation of the Association in Thurles, and its contribution to the fostering of Gaelic Games. Indicative of the mammoth contribution of the County to the game of hurling is the selection on the 'An Post' team of the Millennium of three icons of the Blue and Gold John Doyle, Jimmy Doyle, and Tony Reddan.

Nobody could dispute their credentials. Between them they have seventeen All-Ireland Senior hurling medals, and an impressive collection of honours won at all levels of the game.

The achievements of teak tough, fearless defender, John Doyle (Holycross-Ballycahill) has been well chronicled. The holder of eight All-Ireland senior medals won in '49, '50, '51, '58, '61, '62, '64, '65, Doyle has deservedly received almost every hurling award in recognition of his unique role in the history of the game.

The supreme stylist with the deft touch, the legendary Jimmy Doyle (Thurles Sarsfields) winner of senior All-Irelands in '58, '61, '62, '64, '65 and '71, is also revered by hurling followers nationwide. Tipperary folk were thrilled to learn of Jimmy's selection and the honour is a fitting tribute to one of the greatest forwards in the history of hurling.

A prince of goalkeepers, Tony Reddan was netminder in Tipperary's memorable All-Ireland treble of '49, '50, '51. Courageous, and possessing an eagle eye when faced with many a difficult task, the Lorrha clubman had few peers.

John, Jimmy and Tony also had the proud distinction of having been selected on the 'Team of the Century' in 1984, and were the people's choice for the Tipperary Star team of the Millennium.

As we gather at the hallowed Semple Stadium grounds this evening for what promises to be a memorable mid-final we pay tribute to the heroic deeds of the 'big three' and their glowing contributions to the game of hurling. Their exploits must serve as a perennial inspiration to the players of today and tomorrow.





READY POSITION



The hurley is usually held in the Ready Position when the ball is not being played. All positions are shown for right handed players



Overhead catching of the ball develops directly from the Ready Position.

LOCK POSITION



Adopt the Ready Position.

Slide the weaker hand down the handle to lock with the stronger hand at the top of the handle.



The Lock Position is adopted when striking the ball from the hand, strong or weak side.
