# To-day's T.S.B. Bank Nenagh North Senior Final

The first North Tipperary Senior Hurling Final has arrived. At first there were nine and now we are down to two. Toomevara, the holders, will face the challenge of near neighbours Moneygall.

The championship has entered its fourth year under the sponsorship of T.S.B. Bank Nenagh. The nine teams that entered were the same as last year except Silvermines had replaced Newport. The former were winners of the County Intermediate championship, while Newport were relegated last September.

The nine teams were divided into two groups of five and four. Both of to-day's finalists were placed in the same group. Toomevara finished first with four wins out of four, while Moneygall came second with three wins out of four. Their only defeat was at the hands of Toomevara, when the champions won by 2-15 to 0-12. This was the eleventh meeting between the sides in the last 35 years, with Toome winning nine games to Moneygall's one. The sides finished level on one occasion, back in 1974.

After finishing first and runners-up in the group stages, both sides set about the task of reaching to-day's final. Firstly, Moneygall had an impressive win over Borrisokane (2-16 to 3-8) and Borris-Ileigh (0-16 to 1-11). The game against Borris-Ileigh has being rated as the best semi-final in years.

Toomevara's campaign has been impressive to-date. In the four group wins they have amassed a total of 7-79, while conceding 1-35. Their semi-final game was a close affair. A one point win over rivals Nenagh Eire Og could have resulted in a draw or maybe a defeat. Injuries have been a constant threat and they played without players like Tommie Dunne and Michael Bevans. The top scorer for Toomevara is Paddy O'Brien on 3-38, while John Doughan has scored 0-35 (0-24 frees) for Moneygall. Toome have many household names George Friend, the Dunne brothers and Paddy O'Brien are key men. New kids like John O'Brien and Paul McGrath plus Brian Duff will help continue Toome's success.

Previously mentioned John Doughan is Moneygall's main score getter and play maker. There's Rocky Collison in goal and the ever improving Mark Keeshan at full forward. Corner forwards Donal Doughan and Diarmuid Kennedy are scoring consistently each day.

One interesting fact about to-day's final is that both team trainers come from Offaly. Pat Joe Whelan's name is familiar with Toome and of course Nenagh Eire Og. He has helped win County finals with each of them. Joachim Kelly coaches Moneygall and it is evident that his style of hurling is clearly spread on this current Moneygall side. The result of this final will depend on two things; can paddy O'Brien repeat his semi-final performance or will Moneygall's new style of first time hurling give the holders a game that will be hard to cope with.

Since 1966 both Toomevara and Moneygall have met on eleven occasions in the championship. Toomevara have won on nine occasions and we have to go back to 1972, when Moneygall inflicted one of Toome's biggest defeats in recent times.

There was one draw in 1974 which ended on a 3-11 to 1-17 scoreline.

There were three first round meetings in '66, '88 and '89 with both teams meeting in the penultimate stages in '94 and '95.

## Special Year

It was in 1979 when Moneygall defeated Borris-Ileigh in a North Tipperary Senior hurling final. The final score read Moneygall 2-13, Borris-Ileigh 3-7. On reaching the final Moneygall gained a place in the County Senior hurling quarter-final. Alas, they haven't played in a County championship since.

## Path to final

The year 1975 was a glorious year for Moneygall as they won both the North and County championships. On route to claiming their North final they defeated Kildangan in the first round, which was soon followed by a two goal defeat at the hands of Borris-Ileigh.

The turning point came when they defeated Roscrea and Silvermines before going on to defeat Lorrha in the semi-final by 1-16 to 2-9.

The final was played on September 4th and Cloughjordan was the venue. Moneygall claimed their first and only North title by 2-10 to 1-11.

# **Éire Óg & Toomevara will replay**

## **GREAT HURLING FINISH AT NENAGH**

**ÉIRE ÓG 4-8 TOOMEVARA 6-2**

In a hard and exciting game at McDonagh Park, Nenagh on Sunday last, Eire Og (Nenagh) and Toomevara played a drawn game in the quarter-finals of the North Tipperary senior hurling championship.

The winners of the re-play will meet Lorrha in the semi-final of the championship. The replay has been fixed for Nenagh on Sunday, August 19th.

Eire Og started off in magnificent style and at the interval were leading by 3-6 to 1-1. At the interval 'Toome' brought on Tipperary junior player Con Ryan and inside two minutes Ryan banged home a goal and a side which was hitherto being lethargic was transformed into a spirited combination.

Toome' kept up the attack and after twenty minutes were leading by a point. Then it was Eire Og's turn to fight back and a goal from a 21 yard free by Johnny McGrath and two points from John Hogan gave them a four point lead. With only six minutes left for play it seemed as if Eire Og would hold out. Then a close in free was sent to the net by Phil Shanahan and amid mounting excitement Con Ryan sent over the equalising point for Toomevara.

# Victory for speed and training

MONEYGALL 4-11 KILADANGAN 4-6

Moneygall won a hard earned victory over Kiladangan in the losers group of the North Tipperary Senior hurling championship at McDonagh Park, Nenagh, on Sunday, when they held on to win by a five point margin over Kiladangan.

The exchanges were fast and tackling robust, but the well-trained and speedy Moneygall boys were on top at the end. Their speed was a factor that Kiladangan had no right to answer to, and their positioning gave them possession of the ball much more often than the Shannonsiders.

From the very first whistle it was seen that Kiladangan would have to use all the craft in defence if they were to hold a fine midfield pair in Tim Collison and P. Ryan while a nippy set of forward depended upon their agility to outwit the heavier defence tactics of the losers. The winners led by eight points after Billy McLeesh scored his sides fourth goal. However, Tim Quigley replied with a goal when he doubled on a long ball from Billy McLoughney. Jack Ryan responded with a point to bring the half-time score to Moneygall 4-5, Kiladangan 2-5.

Prospects for a win looked brighter for the Shannonsiders when following a quick point for the restart, McLoughney banged through a great goal to leave a goal in favour of Moneygall. Eddie McLoughney saved and turned a ball over his head and the ball was cleared in a great scrummage, but a 21 yard free fell to Moneygall and J. Ryan pointed. J. Gleeson added a point. From a free J. Ryan then pointed and McLoughney saved a hot shot from P. Ryan who had plenty of room to work in. The same player had another point from a 21 yard free. At the other end where Kiladangan were fighting hard to reduce the arrears, B. McDonnell had a splendid goal from 25 yards out to lower the margin to five points. McDonnell had a point for Kiladangan but J. Ryan had the last score of the game, a point for the winners. Mr. Doney Nealon had charge of the whistle.
