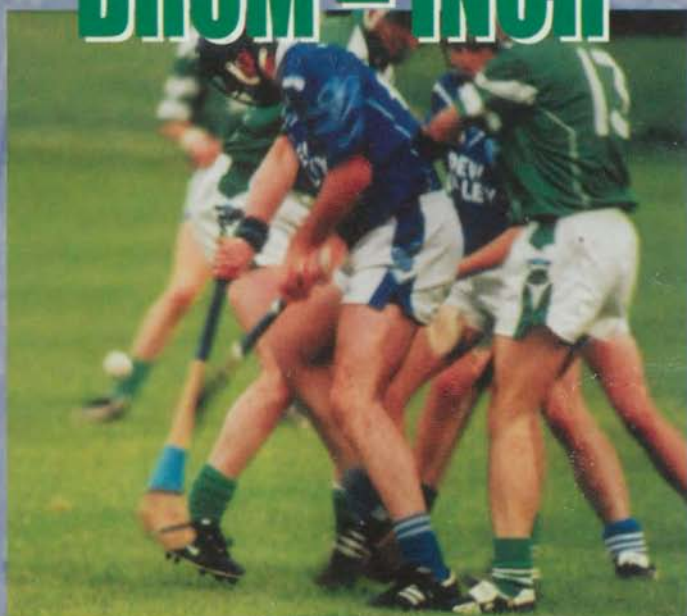

'The Drawn Game'- How the Tipp Star saw it

It was a final which was packed with incident and which had the large attendance on its toes from the start. Drom-Inch were regarded as outsiders but they played out of their skins, showing legitimate aggression and a high level of skill as they put a slow start behind them to dictate the pace.

Sarsfields had to call on all their character to rescue their title aspirations. With the departure of the two "big guns" their chances of the goal they needed to ignite their challenge, looked slim but Pat Lawlor played a key role in keeping them in the frame when heads might have dropped, and their perseverance was rewarded when county under 21 goalie, Patrick McCormack, in the most demanding of situations, held his nerve to unleash an unstoppable penalty shot to the net in the last minute.

Drom-Inch, slower to settle, and finding themselves 0-1 to 0-3 adrift after four minutes, thanks to Redser O'Grady's opening salvo for Sarsfields, got the break they needed to ignite their challenge when Frankie McGrath's burst and shot for goal was parried by Patrick McCormack but the in-rushing Kevin Butler finished to the net to put them in front in the 9th minute.

The score transformed the team and with Seamus Butler, operating at midfield, and having a blinder, they stretched a jittery Sarsfields defence to the limit. A yellow card for Redser in the 18th minute was to be significant, but four minutes from the break, a dash from the Drom goal area by Eamon Buckley and a lengthy delivery, saw Frankie McGrath flick home Drom's second goal, setting them up for a 2-7 to 0-8 lead at the break.

An incident-packed second half had everything. Ritchie Ruth came on for Sarsfields and Redser blazed off the crossbar but Drom were holding firm, and drawing inspiration from a Damian Young point from a free from his own fifty meter line in the 3rd minute. Points by Ruth and Pat Lawlor had Sarsfields four off the pace when Ger O'Grady was sent to the line after a dispute with a linesman earned him a second yellow card.

Down to fourteen men, worse was to come for the Blues. Johnny Enright landed a great point but in doing so got injured and had to retire in the 9th minute. Seamus Butler hit a magnificent point for Drom and cousin MacDara followed suit to restore Drom's five point margin.

Sarsfields were trying manfully to close the gap but Drom kept nicking off points, McDara Butler, twice doing so while Sarsfields saw a goal chance slip by when Ritchie Ruth's batted effort off Pat Lawlor's pass, skidded wide of the post.

Lawlor was Sarsfields saviour in those closing minutes. His accuracy reaped five points in the last quarter but with time running out, a goal still separated the sides. When Lawlor was grounded going for goal, referee Noel Cosgrove had no hesitation in awarding a penalty. Patrick McCormack made the long journey forward and with great aplomb had the ball in the net before the Drom defence realised it was hit.

Will History Repeat Itself; 1984 Drom-Inch last title

Drom-Inch 0.13 Moycarkey - Borris 2.07/ Replay Drom-Inch 1.09 Moycarkey 1.08.

When Drom-Inch last collected the Mid Tipp. Senior hurling title in centenary year they had to go to a replay before they got their hands on the trophy. First of all they had to overcome Boherlahen-Dualla in the final of the losers group, defeating them by 3.09 to 1.09. They then defeated a fancied Holycross-Ballycahill side in the Mid semi-final by 3.13 to 0.07. In the other semi-final Moycarkey-Borris beat Loughmore-Castleiney by 3.13 to 3.06. So on August 25th Drom-Inch squared up to a very fancied Moycarkey-Borris side who were appearing in their fourth consecutive mid-final in Semple Stadium. Drom-Inch led at the interval by 0.06 to 0.04 however in the first minute of the second half there was a mix-up between their goalkeeper Pat Harkin and a defensive colleague. Dickie Quigley nicked in and scored a goal for Moycarkey-Borris. Drom showed great character scoring three excellent points to forge ahead again, but once again their hopes and dreams were shattered when a long delivery from Moycarkeys Tom Noonan who had just come on as a sub ended up in the Drom net. Once again the sides were level with five minutes remaining, in fact Moycarkey had three great chances to seal victory but all three went wide. Seamus Hassett then sent the Drom supporters into seventh heaven with a great point. Moycarkey fought back with two Jack Bergin pointed 65s however a last minute free by Johnny Harkins saved the day from Drom-Inch to leave the final score Drom-Inch 0.13 Moycarkey-Borris 2.07.

THE REPLAY

The replay took place once again in Semple Stadium on Sunday 9th September and yet again Moycarkey-Borris were favourites for the title. The Drom defence were magnificent on the day, keeping their opponents at bay with few scoring chances available even though they lay siege on the Drom goal. The Drom-Inch side were four points up with ten minutes to go when Moycarkey-Borris through John Flanagan and John McCormack levelled the game and looked like pulling away from their opponents, as Michael Dundon wrote in his match report in the Tipperary Star, "Drom resisted the fierce pressure on them, and in the last minute won a free for themselves well inside their own half. Paudie Butler shaped up to the ball, spotted that brother Tommy had slipped out loose to the left, and deftly lobbed the ball into his hand. Tommy turned and in a twinkling, the ball was over the bar and the Treacy Cup was on its way to The Ragg". The final score was Drom-Inch 1.09 Moycarkey-borris 1.08.

Unique Triple Crown for Thurles Sarsfields

The year 1955 was arguable Sarsfields most successful year on the playing fields of Tipperary. In the senior hurling final Sarsfields who were captained by Mickey (Rattler) Byrne defeated Borrisoleigh by 4.10 to 0-6. Playing for Sarsfields that day were M. Craddock, T. Ryan, P. McCarthy, T. Wall, P. J. O'Brien, L. Keane, M. McElgunn, T. Barrett, Martin (Musha) Maher, J. Kearns, M. Byrne, C. Keane, M. Keane, M. Butler and B. Mockler.

The junior team was of exceptional quality. In its numbers were two players who would go on and captain Tipperary to senior All-Ireland glory, Jimmy Doyle (1962 & 1965) and Michael Murphy (1964), while Noel Murphy and Liam McLoughlin would also win Senior All-Ireland medals with Tipp. In the junior hurling county final Sarsfields defeated Toomevara by 6-7 to 1-5. Sarsfields team was N. Murphy, M. Butler, T. Butler, F. Jordan, S. McLoughlin, W. Hackett, D. Butler, M. Connors, M. Murphy, P. Dorney, J. Doyle, F. Barrett, M. Stapleton, M. Cahill and J. Loughnane.

Thurles Sarsfields minor hurling team in 1955 was captained by Jimmy Doyle and they defeated Nenagh Eire Og by 7-4 to 2-1. Lining out for Sarsfields that day were M. Maher, M. Ryan, M. Craddock, S. 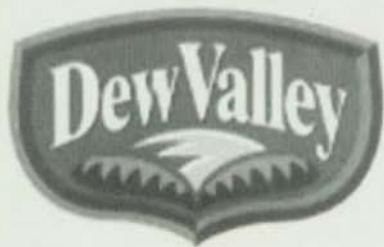
