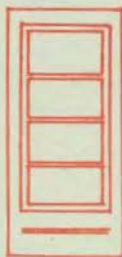

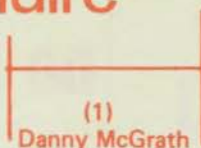

Carrick Davins – Title Holders

Although Davin's first Senior Title was not gained until 1965 their success story started back in the early thirties in Minor and Junior grade. Their Juniors defeated Killenaule by 3-3 to 3-1 at Cloneen to take the '31 title but this was later lost on appeal. The Minors took four successive titles from 1933 to 1936 but it was really the year 1963 which saw the Juniors take the South and County Crown, that heralded the start of a great run of success. The winning of County Senior titles in 1966 and 1967 will go down as the Club's greatest achievement. Initially founded as a Junior Football Club in 1922, Davins enjoyed almost immediate success winning South and County Titles in 1927.
