St. Mary's seek Second Senior Title

Since its foundation in 1929 the Club has attracted a wide range of dedicated members from all walks of life whose main objective has been to promote the game of hurling among the people of Clonmel and particularly to foster a love for the game among the youth of Clonmel. That they succeeded is borne out by the fact that St. Mary's H.C. has gone from strength to strength over the years and have captured quite a number of titles, both divisional and county, from Juvenile to Senior grade.

Up to 1981 the Club had won every title in hurling that South Tipperary had to offer with the exception of the elusive senior title. However, 1981 proved to be our year at senior level when a gallant St. Mary's team defeated old rivals Carrick Swan at Kilsheelan in the South Final, thus giving the Club its first title. Having regard to the success that was achieved at Juvenile, Minor and U/21 level in previous years it was inevitable that success would come sooner or later at Senior level as quite a number of the senior team are products of the Club's juvenile nursery. Our juvenile teams can boast of many successes, not least of which were winning the County U/21 title in 1980; County U/14 title in 1981 and the County Feile Title in 1982. The club also captured the Co. Junior title in 1975 and this team included quite a number of the present senior panel.

This senior team includes a number of players who have worn the County jersey at one grade or another and who have played on Tipperary All-Ireland winning teams at minor and U/21 level — players such as Vincent Mullins, Willie Peters and Franny Kelly. Other players who have worn the Co. jersey with distinction are Tommy Walsh, Paudie O'Neill, Seamie O'Neill, Tony Smith, Jimmy Ryan, Mossy Carroll and Brian Carroll. Mossy came to the club in 1981 and took over as coach/player with the senior team. His dedicated work and commitment with the senior team was a major factor which contributed to our success in 1981 and which has brought St. Mary's to another South Final in the current year. Mossy's brother Brian is now also a regular member of our team and his enthusiasm and drive has proven vital in all our games played to date.

St. Mary's success in recent times at senior level has been due mainly to team work. Each player has worked hard and diligently at training throughout the year and to date this effort has paid handsome dividends and we are hopeful that today St. Mary's H.C. will record their second success at Senior level.

Finally, a special work of thanks to our kind sponsors who have helped the club in so many ways during the year.

St. Augustines-A Formidable Combination

St. Augustines are a combination of Kilsheelan and Fethard and they have enjoyed considerable success over the years, particularly in the under age grades. Both Kilsheelan and Fethard have, of course, a great hurling tradition. Fethard were Senior Hurling Champions in 1919 and more recently in 1937 and 1938. In later years Coolmoyne carried the banner for the area and they fielded some outstanding teams, particularly the championship winning side of 1951.

Kilsheelan have not enjoyed success at Senior level but a number of players from that Parish played leading roles in the Na Piersaigh successes of 1956 and 1957. In 1957 also Kilsheelan won their first junior crown and they have been to the fore in junior and intermediate grades ever since.

St. Augustines won their way to South finals on two previous occasions, their last appearance being in 1972 when they went under to Carrick Davins at Davin Park. The present St. Augustines team has contributed handsomely to the success of the Senior championship in recent years and they won their way to the semi-finals two years ago when they failed by 4-12 to 4-3 against Carrick Davins at Clonmel.

There is every hope that 1982 will prove a milestone in the history of the combination who in the opinion of many will prove more than a match for St. Mary's in today's final and will whatever the outcome emerge worthy ambassadors for the South Division in the County Quarter-finals on August 8th.





UNIQUE DOUBLE YOUR MONEY SCHEME BY TIPP TO RAISE £500,000 FOR 1984 FINAL

Given that it was at Thurles in 1884 that the infant G.A.A. was born, where else but at Thurles should the Centenary All-Ireland Hurling Final of 1984 be played?

Work on the completion of the development of Semple Stadium - the late Thomas Joseph Semple, who died in 1943 at the age of 64 years, being one of the greatest hurling captains of all time and a prime mover in acquiring the Thurles Sportsfield from the Thurles Show Committee in 1910 - is scheduled to begin in a couple of months.

The new phase will include the provision of terracing at the Killinan End and environs, the provision of accesses, egresses and complementary facilities, plus the landscaping of the entire development.

Development work costing £850,000 - of which £500,000 has already been raised - has been completed. The work involved the provision of a new stand with covered seating for 10,500 improvements to the existing stand, terracing of the Town End and major improvements on facilities for the Press and general public.

It is also planned to extend the Town End terracing to the new stand and to provide sunken sideline seating - there is ample room for this - and approximately 60 stiles. That, it has been estimated, will give an overall ground capacity of 65,000 - via new stand (10,500), Old Stand (16,500), Sideline (3,000), Town End terracing (17,000) and Killinan End terracing (18,000).
