Killenaule has a long and successful record in South S.H.C. Finals. Older patrons will remember their tremendous tussels with the famed Boherlahan teams of the 1920s and early 30s. The 40s and 50s were probably their most successful years, when many titles were won and again in the 60s the cup made its way twice more to Killenaule. Our current president, Ned Cooke was a member of many of those teams and holds a record 9 South senior medals.

Having been out of senior ranks for a number of years the club are delighted to be once again in a south final in their first year back in senior ranks. Most of the present team have played in a number of senior finals with Eire Og and all of the team played in 5 south under 21 finals (winning four) and in four intermediate finals. Whilst they have not been over impressive in the early rounds they are still in the final and if they can hit true form on the day they can put Killenaule's name back on the senior record again.
