

JOHN KENNEDY (Senior game)

Referee for today's Senior game is John Kennedy of the host club, Clonoulty/Rossmore. John may be described as a "late vocation" to refereeing and it is a tribute to his ability that he has been appointed to this major fixture in his third year as a referee.

John has unselfishly devoted his time and energies to all aspects of G.A.A. activity over the years. He played at all levels with his club, winning a Crosco Cup medal with Clonoulty/Rossmore in 1969. He also played at corner-back on the Tipperary Minor Hurling team of 1960 defeated in the All-Ireland by Dublin. While working in Dublin he won a County Championship medal in Senior Hurling with the Young Irelands club in 1965. The following year he won a Mid Championship medal with Holycross.



John has been actively involved in club administration also over the years, serving terms as club Chairman and Treasurer as well as training teams at all levels from Juvenile to Senior.

John's motto as a referee is to be fair to everyone and to accept the fact that mistakes are inevitable. He refereed last year's West Minor Hurling "B" final and the West Junior Hurling final in 1989.

TOM MEEHAN (Minor Football)

Tom will be the "man in black" for today's Minor Football West Final in this his sixteenth year as a West Board Referee.

Tom represented his club, Cashel King Cormacs, as a player in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Football, the highlight of his career being in 1976 when he won West and County Championship medals in Intermediate Football.

On the administration level, Tom has served as club secretary and P.R.O. as well as being involved with juveniles. Tom has succeeded John Moloney as Chairman of West Tipperary Referee's Committee this year.

Also this year Tom officiated at his first Inter-County fixture, the Minor Football match between Kerry and Waterford. He is also due to referee the County Senior Football Semi-Final this evening.

RICHARD BARRY (Minor Hurling)

Cappawhite's Richard Barry takes charge of today's Minor Hurling final in his third year as a referee.

Like John Kennedy, Richard became involved in refereeing through a course for new referees conducted by John Moloney three years ago under the auspices of the West Board.

Richard played hurling and football for his club from Juvenile to Under 21 level. He became actively involved in the administration of his club in 1977 when becoming a committee member of the Cappawhite club and he is currently Vice-Chairman of the club. He has, over the years, been a selector on Juvenile and Minor teams. He is also Chairman of West Tipperary Bord na nÓg and Vice Chairman of County Bord na nÓg.

Richard refereed this year's Under 21 "B" Hurling final and officiated at last year's County finals in Under 12 Hurling and Football.

"I referee it as I see it and try to be fair to both sides", is Richard's motto as a referee.

The West Divisional Gaelic Athletic Association Board was founded on January 26th, 1930. George Furlong represented Cappawhite at the inaugural meeting as did Mike Kelly of

Donohill.

At this time there was no parish rule and Cappawhite/Donohill was the local team for a number of years. The first games to be played in the new West Division was football and up to one thousand people attended at Graffin/Annacarty to witness the home side lose to the much heftier Cappawhite/Donohill combination.

In 1931, Cappawhite/Donohill entered the Senior Hurling Championship arena for the first time and lost to Newport, a stronger team, on July 13th at Newport on the score of 6-4

to 2-3-

Mike Kelly was appointed temporary secretary of the West Board in 1932. Cappawhite/Donohill reached its first Senior Hurling West Final this year. The side lost to the all conquering Clonoulty team who won its third West title at Ballydine on the score of 6-2 to 3-2. This was a well contested game, although the second half was marred by some rough play and uncalled for incidents. Pat Furlong scored 3-1 out of his sides total of 3-2.

In 1933, Cappawhite secured a fairly suitable playing field from the Land Commission in the division of the Greenfield Estate. Again the combination was defeated in its second Senior Hurling final by Clonoulty in Tipperary despite having trained very hard for it. The grand alliance between Cappawhite and Donohill broke up in 1934 and Cappawhite did not field a Senior team again until 1943.

In 1942, Cappawhite won its first County Hurling title, a Junior one, and had to go Senior in 1943. Cappawhite matched Eire Og, Annacarty, for three quarters of an hour in the West Senior Hurling Final, losing by the score of 8-1 to 3-2. Eire Og went on to win its first County

Senior Hurling title.

In 1957 Cappawhite joined with Solohead and Glengar to form Saint Nicholas whose

training ground was at Monard.

The combination defeated Knockavilla/Kickhams in the Semi-Final, who were seeking their sixth title in a row and were then favourites against Cashel King Cormacs in the final. The newly formed Cappawhite Pipers Band paraded both teams on August 18th, at Dundrum. The combination won by the score 5-8 to 3-6. Man of the Match was the captain J. "Yank" Crowe and the superiority of mid-fielders Dan Greene and Wm. (Harry) Bradshaw contributed mostly to their success.

In 1961, Cappawhite joined with Eire Og Annacarty and Glengar to form St. Vincents. This combination defeated Solohead in the final at Cashel on August 12th by the score of 4-7 to 1-7.

The following year in 1962, Cappawhite had entered a Senior team of its own and assisted by the Glengar trio, Wm. (Harry) Bradshaw, Wm. Ryan (Gough), and Jim Buckley, defeated the famed Knockavilla Kickhams in the West Final by the score of 5-8 to 2-1. Captain Bradshaw was "Man of the Match" and hurled like a man inspired.

Cappawhite lost the next four finals it played in: Cashel 1976, Sean Treacys 1978, 1979, Eire Og/Annacarty 1981.

In 1983, Cappawhite officially opened its new hurling field with a Tipperary versus Limerick Senior Hurling match. The club was again in a final and were hoping to put aside all their frustrations and disappointments of latter years. The final against Cashel King Cormacs was played at Golden on August 21st. With skill, fitness and determination, Cappawhite outplayed Cashel from the very beginning, leading by nine points at the interval and went on to win by thirteen points at the sound of the final whistle.

Conor Ryan (H) led his team successfully to two more West titles in 1984 and 1985 at the expense of Knockavilla/Kickhams and Cashel King Cormacs respectively. Mr. G. Ring, secretary of the West Board, in his report to Convention in January, 1987, bemoaned the fact that no West Tipperary team contested any County Final in hurling in 1986. Cappawhite played Clonoulty/Rossmore in an amazing and exciting West Final on September 13th at Cashel. Clonlouty led Cappawhite by nine points at half-time. Because of changes made in the line-out for the second half and with the "pride of the little village" at stake, Cappawhite reduced a nine point lead and won by an astonishing eight point margin.

The team defeated Roscrea in a County Quarter Final and Thurles Sarsfields in the Semi-Final. The County Centenary Senior Hurling Final took place at Thurles on November 1st against Mid Champions, Loughmore/Castleiney. In the final minutes of the game,

Cappawhite shot the winning point to win by 1-17 to 2-13.

Cappawhite made an historic and clean sweep of the Senior Hurling trophies in Tipperary for the year 1987 winning West, County and Crosco Cup. The club also lost the final of the Munster Senior Hurling Championship by a single point to Middleton who won out the club All-Ireland title.

The hurlers lost their West and County title to Clonoulty/Rossmore in the first round of the West Championship 1988.

In 1989, Clonoulty/Rossmore defeated Cappawhite in the West Final by the score of 3-20 to 4-6 at Emly and went on to win the County Senior Hurling title.

The years from 1981 to 1991 could be described as Cappawhite's Golden Decade of Hurling. The club contested six West Finals out of nine, winning four and a County title. Todays final is its seventh in ten years and this panel of players who were trail-blazers extraordinary, elegant stickmen, super sportsmen, will strive to write one more chapter of history for the "lovely little village"

MICKEY "THE DASHER" MURPHY

Mickey, "The Dasher" Murphy, has the unique distinction of being the only Cashel man to hold seven West Senior Hurling medals. They were won during the great era of Cashel hurling, 1934 to 1948. The successful years were 1934, 1936, 1937, 1939, 1940, 1945 and 1948. Like many other players from that period, Mickey believes that the teams should have won more and deserved a County Final. Mickey brought his career to a close by winning a County Junior Final. This was the 1953 final which wasn't played until 1954. On the same team, his son, Johnny, who won Minor All-Ireland medals with Tipperary in 1953 and 1955, played. What was it like to play with his son? "I'd probably be on for another three years but I got embarrassed reading in the newspapers about father and son!"

MICHAEL BURKE

MICHAEL BURKE'S hurling career also stretches back to the 1930's. His brilliance began to shine in 1931 when he won a Harty Cup medal with Rockwell. He played the following two years without success but his rising star was recognised when he was picked on the Munster Colleges team that won the Inter-Provincial series in both years. Even greater honours were to come to him in the same years when he won All-Ireland Minor Hurling medals with Tipperary. On the team with him in 1932 was Jimmy Cooney who was probably the reason why Tipperary and Michael Burke didn't win a Senior All-Ireland in 1938. Making his championship debut with the county in 1936 he gave a sparkling performance scoring 1-5. He was to be on and off the team until 1942 but he wasn't on when the team was victorious in 1937. His career with Cashel stretches right up to 1948.

PATSY O'CONNOR

Of more recent vintage is Patsy O'Connor, one of the O'Connor clan that gave so much service to Cashel hurling during the sixties and the seventies. With his two brothers, Derry and John, they accumulated no less than twelve West Senior Hurling medals. Patsy's were won in 1965, 1971, 1975, 1976 and 1980. He had the distinction of captaining the 1976 team which defeated Cappawhite at Emly. Probably the high point of his career was in 1967 when he won an All-Ireland under 21 medal against Dublin. Another Cashel man on the team that day was Conor Davitt. Patsy's contribution to that victory was impressive: he scored 1-3 of Tipperary's total of 1-8. Although his favourite position was in the half forward line he played corner-forward on that occasion. His performance impressed because be was brought on to the Senior panel and played league games with the county over a period of three years. He has an Oireachtas medal from 1968.

Peter O'Sullivan had to retire with a broken finger and although Cappa came into the game strongly on the turnaround the early lead was too much. Cappa had the assistance of Solohead's T.J. Riordan under a gentleman's agreement. It's the only occasion Cashel beat Cappa in the final.

One of the stars of the day was Cashel's half-back, Johnny Murphy who scored 1-4. It was Cappa's first sampling of Senior success; for Cashel the fifties was to be a barren decade.

50 YEARS AGO - Eire Og Western Champions

Eire Og led by 3-2 to 1-4 at half time. Golden rallied gamely and were leading a few minutes from the end by two points. Then Eire Og struck for the winner when "Jerry Ryan placed his namesake Jerry Ryan (W) for a goal to give them the lead and the Championship".

In the County semi-Final Eire Og went on to defeat Killenaule but lost the final to Boherlahan on the score 2-2 to 0-6. The Eire Og County Final team was: J. O'Donnell, M. Dwyer, J. Hanly, J. Dee, W. 25 YEARS AGO - Arravale Rvs. West Champions

On the West Tipp roll of honour, Arravale Rovers have just two titles, both won against Golden/Kilfeacle. The last success was twenty one years ago in 1970 but the first was a full quarter of a century past in 1966. Wins over Cashel and Kickhams carried Rovers through to the West Final for the first time in the clubs history. The venue was Dundrum, the referee, John Moloney.

The game was a thriller. The sides were level at half time, Arravale Rovers 1-2, Golden 0-5. The decisive move came in the last quarter. With time running out and the Rovers a point behind they brought John O'Donoghue out of goal replacing him with Terry Moloney. Within seconds of his emergence O'Donoghue secured the ball at midfield, evaded two tackles, soloed thirty yards before parting to P.T. O'Dwyer who netted to give Rovers a two point lead that they subsequently held.

The Rovers were beaten in the County Quarter Final by Toomevara.
