


AN HISTORIC DAY FOR BALLYPOREEN

Whatever their fate in today's S.F.C. Semi-Final, Ballyporeen will make history as this is their first ever appearance at this level.

This year they graduated to senior ranks for the first time since 1971 following the South and County Intermediate successes of 1992. However, it took "Bally" quite a while to make the breakthrough as they played Intermediate grade right through the seventies and contested only one South Final.

Their decision to regrade to Junior in the early eighties proved successful but it took a number of years before a South title was won in 1985. A County Junior title followed in 1987 and the following year "Bally" stepped up to take the South Intermediate title and were denied County honours by the narrowest of margins.

Ballyporeen went on to suffer three consecutive South Final defeats but there was consolation in 1990 when a County Under 21B title was won (many of that winning side are on today's senior team).

1992 proved a marvellous year for the club as not alone was that elusive County Intermediate crown finally won but the club joined with Skeheenarinka Hurling Club to purchase a playing field. The clubs now have dressing rooms almost completed in a venture that is being carried out on a voluntary basis.

The Tipperary Co. Board Draw is the club's main source of income and they wish to thank all their loyal supporters for their response to fund-raising and for their great vocal support at their games.

UPWARD HURLING MARCH OF MULLINAHONE

- 1987 lost to Ballingarry in 1st round of South Tipp. Junior Hurling Championship fielded first ever own minor hurling team and lost Minor "B" final to Fethard after a replay.
- 1988 lost South Tipp. Junior Final to Moyle Rovers fielded in -21 grade for first time ever and won -21"B" county hurling title (Mullinahone's first ever) county hurling.
- 1989 won Tipperary Junior and -21"A" titles lost South Tipp. M.H."B" final to Ballybacon/Grange.
- 1990 won All Ireland Junior "7"s title won South Tipp. Intermediate title losing County Final won South Tipp. M.H."B" title beating Ballingarry.
- 1991 retained South Tipp. Intermediate hurling title and lost county semi-final with depleted team.
- 1992 beaten in South Tipp, senior semi-final replay and also in South Tipp Under 21 final.
- 1993 reached South Tipp. Senior final for the first time, -14 side reach County rural final for first time having won third South Tipp. title (others 1986 & 1990). This team also won the club's first U14 U/R Title on Wednesday night last.

The following Mullinahone club players have represented Tipperary in championship hurling: Mick Cahill R.I.P. (minor), John Leahy (senior, under 21 & minor), Brian O'Meara (junior, under 21 and minor), Michael Skehan (minor), Philip Skehan (minor), Sean Brett (junior), Pat Croke (minor) and Kyran Vaughan (minor).



Best wishes to the Carrick Swans in the South Senior Hurling Final



SWANS' FINEST HOUR

An unusual emissary left Clonmel Sportsfield for Carrick-on-Suir on the afternoon of Sunday 26th October, 1947; it was a carrier pigeon bringing the good news that Swan had defeated Borrisoleigh 5-4 to 2-2 in the County Senior Hurling Final, thus bringing the Dan Breen Cup to the Suirside town for the first time in its history.

Earlier in the year, Swan had to battle all the way to turn back the challenge of their flerce rivals Killenaule by a single point, 4-7 to 4-6, in a thrilling South Final, but from then on they went from strength to strength, defeating Holycross in the semi-final and then rather easily accounting for a Borrisoleigh team, powered by minor star Paddy Kenny and his brother, Sean.

The big men in the Swan side that day were midfielder Tom Wall, his brother Willie, who captained the side from the full-back position, goalie Paddy Fleming; Jack Murphy, a very able midfield assistant to Tom Wall; Paddy Kelly, who never allowed Paddy Kenny to get into the game; and forwards "Hawk" Nugent and "Three Goal" Paddy Madden.

Every man on the team, however, was a hero that day, and they were given a royal reception when they returned to Carrick with the Cup that evening.

The attendance at Clonmel Sportsfield was in excess of 8,000 and over 800 travelled by train and nearly 1,000 by car and bicycle from Carrick.


