J. J. Kennedy Reports

Champions and favourites, Cashel, face Clonoulty/Rossmore, the only West team to beat them in a championship game in the nineties.

The 1992 West Final is one Clonoulty will wish to focus on as they prepare for this latest attempt to upset the Kings. That day at Bansha stands apart in Clonoulty's history as the only occasion in which they beat the King Cormacs in a West Final. It was all the more momentous as Cashel, at the time, were reigning Munster champions who earlier that year had played out their epic All-Ireland encounters with Kiltormer. In all other five West Final meetings between the sides the King Cormacs have ruled the roost, including the last occasion they met in 1994, when Clonoulty had victory snatched by a late equalising goal from Sean Slattery and then lost the replay.

Amazingly that 1992 final is the only West Championship game Cashel have lost in the nineties. It's a remarkable record that has seen them win five of the last six West Championships including the three-in-a-row. That three-in-a-row was something no other Cashel side had ever achieved and now they chase a four-in-a-row, something only Clonoulty and Eire Og have managed in the past, and only Kickhams have bettered with five-in-a-row in the fifties.

Unlike Clonoulty, Cashel have played at the New Inn venue already this year but it wasn't the happiest of experiences for the King Cormacs. That was back in May when they scrambled a first round win over Golden/Kilfeacle by 2-10 to 1-11 on the same day that Clonoulty had a first round win over Eire Og at Dundrum, 0-10 to 1-3. They've had to wait over two months then for their semi-finals with Clonoulty ousting Kickhams a fortnight ago by 3-13 to 2-6 and Cashel last week ditching Cappawhite by 4-17 to 1-14.

It's a Cashel side that is again weakest in attack as evidenced by the move of Conal Bonnar to the front line of the attack, a move that brought benefit in the past. T. J. Connolly and Timmy Moloney are the central characters there alongside Bonnar, with Michael Butler, Seanie O'Donoghue and his younger brother, Ronan, completing the sextet in the semi-final against Cappawhite. Moloney's free-taking can be crucial.

Against that Clonoulty have an impressive recruit this year in County Minor, Michael Kennedy, the star of their semi-final win over Kickhams. Much will depend on the form of such as Declan Ryan and Dan Quirke in attack too with Michael Heffernan, Joe Hayes and Kevin Lanigan-Ryan completing the format the last day. James Ryan and Maurice Quirke were introduced also.

Cashel's major strength at midfield is Colm Bonnar who was partnered the last day by his brother, Ailbe. Against that Clonoulty have been depending on Kevin Ryan and Tim Shanahan whose form has been moderate enough.

Cashel's defence has been stable all year with Pat O'Donoghue and Willie Fitzell in the central positions and Liam Barron, Michael Perdue, Joe O'Leary and Raymie Ryan on the flanks. Against that Clonoulty have introduced Peter

Brennan this year to full back with Noel Keane moving aside to corner. Aidan Butler has made his mark at number six with John Kennedy finding a new lease of life at number five and Phil Shanahan and Alan O'Dwyer completing the line-up.

In goal for Clonoulty/Rossmore they are depending on the long-serving Andrew Fryday and Kevin O'Sullivan manning Cashel's last line of defence.

So the battle lines are drawn for what promises to be an exciting tussle. Cashel seek their 19th Divisional title while Clonoulty look for their 8th. Clonoulty's form so far this year has been distinctly mediocre, although they'll obviously hope that the big day and the sight of Cashel will lift them as it did in '92. Mind you, Cashel themselves have looked vulnerable too on occasions this year, especially in the first round against Golden and in the Crosco Final against Kickhams. They showed better things against Cappawhite last Sunday and will hope for a carry-over to the final of such scoring exploits as yielded 4-17 against Cappawhite.

So, can Clonoulty halt the four-in-a-row? Past evidence and present form says no. The defeated finalists will play off with the Crosco winners or runners-up, for a place in the County Quarter-Finals against North Division.

PAST WEST FINAL MEETINGS - by J. J. Kennedy

1994 - Cashel 2-12 . . . Clonoulty/Rossmore 1-8 (Replay)

It was only the third West Final ever to go to a replay. The sides met at Dundrum on August 14th and Clonoulty looked in trouble early on when they slipped behind and then had centre back, Aidan Butler, sent off. But Declan Ryan goaled a 20 metre free before the break and a Dan Quirke goal in the second half slipped Clonoulty into the lead before Sean Slattery rescued Cashel with a brilliant late goal.

The replay was delayed until after the county series and it was October 30th before the sides lined-up again at Dundrum. This time Cashel had goals in the first quarter from Cormac Bonnar and John Ryan and went on to win comfortably to take their 17th West Championship.

A Cormac Bonnar goal took Cashel four clear at one stage in the second half and eventhough Clonoulty fought back bravely they could never fully undo the damage.

The 1940 final was played at Dundrum and by winning Cashel became the first owners of the O'Dwyer Cup. To get to the final Cashel beat Solohead 4-1 to 2-2 and Golden 4-4 to 1-1. Clonoulty got a first round bye and beat Eire Og in the semi-final. Cashel led 4-1 to 0-3 at half time. In the County Semi-Final the West Champions defeated Kilruane but lost the County Final to Moycarkey on the score 4-7 to 4-2.

1934 - Cashel 2-5 . . . Cusacks (Clonoulty) 0-1.

1934 was the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the GAA and a Clonoulty team took the name Cusacks in honour of the founder. The West was formed in 1930 and Clonoulty had taken the first four senior hurling championships but in 1934 Cashel, in their first appearance in the final, relieved them of the crown.

Cashel defeated a Multeen Rovers team in the first round 4-3 to 3-0 and Cusacks had a bye to the final. The game was played at Knockavilla and Cashel led 2-3 to 0-1 at half time. Cashel were beaten by Moycarkey, the eventual champions, in the county semi-final.

Rockwell Rovers Field Development 1988 - 1996

The events of today are the realization of the dreams held by many members of Rockwell Rovers down through the decades. Our club, one of the oldest in Tipperary (founded in 1887), is now in the final stages of development of the GAA pitch and dressing rooms. Much effort and hard work is nearing reward, with almost all of the main work completed and 85% of the development paid for. A sum of £148,000 (approx.) has been invested in the facilities to date and a debt of £23,000 (approx.) remains. During this period club running expenses were also catered for and the total amount of money collected is £175,000 (approx.) Tribute is due to the hard-working committee which has worked courageously to plan and raise finance for the development since 1988.

The development was initiated by the club committee at the end of 1988 with the purchase of 11.5 acres near the village of New Inn. A very foreseeing decision was then made by the committee with the help of Tipperary GAA officials to swop the original site for another more suitable one. This was done with the generous agreement of the owner of the alternative site on the main Cork-Dublin road, Eamon Barron. The new site had been previously used by Rockwell Rovers Club for many years with the kind permission of the then owner Edmond Barron (RIP), who worked tirelessly for the club for many years. Rockwell College also supplied our team with pitches over the years and deserve great acclaim for all the work they have done for our club, as did many other landowners. The present

development now possesses a large natural bank for up to 8,000 spectators giving an excellent view of the pitch. The field complex also has the advantage of being beside the national school where we are grateful to our teachers and coaches who use it regularly.

A confined draw in 1988, organized by the club committee under the chairmanship of Walter O'Donnell, began the fundraising which was then followed by a house to house collection. True to form the people of New Inn and Knockgraffon came up trumps and the development was well and truly on the way. A further four extremely well organized 300 draws held in 1991, '92, '93 and '94, plus five successful yearly festivals in co-operation with the New Inn Community Council helped to break the back of the debt. We wish to acknowledge the help of New Inn Community Centre in fundraising. Members of the finance committee who helped raise the finance are Andy Moloney, Martin Peters, Willie Flynn, Tom Shine, Ger O'Connor, Tom O'Gorman, Kevin Barron, Secretary, Walter O'Donnell, Eamon Barron, Treasurer and Tom Buckley. Of course all the promoters who helped (see below) put in a lot of work.

Development of the pitch and the fencing of surrounds, together with the building of the dressing rooms and stand and its ideal location have ensured that the New Inn venue is now in a position to hold many important matches in the future.

It is difficult to pick out any individual to attribute the success of the development to as it was a true community

effort with people from all walks of life rowing in to ensure success despite difficulty at times. It would, of course, be remiss of me not to mention the late Fr. Meehan who throughout his life in New Inn and other places, gave unsparingly of his time, effort and fundraising ability to help make the venture a success. Considerable help was also given by Mary Peters, Mary Moloney, Mary Flynn and Margaret O'Gorman in organizing of the draws.
