



KILSHEELAN

Founded in 1924 the Club has a very proud tradition in the promotion of our national games in the division. South and County Junior Football titles were won in 1924/25/42/50 and '64. South Senior Football titles in 1930/33/70 and '83. County honours in 1930/33/68 and '72. The period 1964 to 1984 was a glorious period for the Club when they also won a number of Intermediate and Junior Hurling titles.

There is also a very strong juvenile structure in place, despite that, little success has been achieved. In recent years a bigger emphasis on coaching has brought the Club divisional titles in U.12, U.14 and U.16 in Football. In 1997 the U.16 Football team reached the County 'B' Final. This year the Club had its first ever County juvenile success when the U.12 Football team were victorious in the 'B' competition.

Both codes are given equal prominence and those players are now coming to the fore at Minor level. Some weeks back they lost out in the Minor 'B' Final and today they will endeavour to win their first ever Minor Hurling title. To reach the Final they had victories over Fr. Sheehy's and Moyle Rovers. Surprisingly the team does not have many links with the past. The most notable is Pierce Larkin whose father and grandfather along with family members have been synonymous with the Club since its foundation.

We wish the team the best of luck and hope that success today will lead into another very fruitful period for the Club.



CLONMEL/CARRICK-ON-SUIR SPECIAL GAMES DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME IS YIELDING RESULTS

In its first year of operation the Clonmel/Carrick-on-Suir Development Programme has become well established in all the schools and clubs in its catchment area. While results must be measured over time, the organizing committee and full-time coach and administrator, Johnny Cummins, are satisfied that the sixth class and first year competitions, indoor hurling, club competitions, schools coaching programmes and positive publicity have led to a marked improvement in the numbers and enthusiasm of children playing the games in both towns.

Feedback from teachers in the Primary and Secondary schools is very positive and they, together with schools management, are to be complimented for their enthusiastic support of the Development Programme.

The clubs in both towns are also giving active support and are using the scheme to complement their own juvenile development activities. The recent

Schools Activity

6th Class Blitzes were held in hurling and football with each school fielding 2 teams, 11-a-Side hurling and 13-a-Side in football. Carrick C.B.S. won both events and Clonmel Sisters of Charity won the girls blitz.

successes of Marlfield in U12C hurling and football are directly attributable to co-operation between the school, development programme and club.

Ist and 2nd Year Hurling Competitions were held to provide games for students entering 2nd level. Carrick Vocational School won this competition and Clonmel High School were the runners up.

The FAS coaching scheme continues to provide weekly coaching sessions in all the primary and second level schools in the area.

Girls Football and Camogie — the promotion of the games in the girls' schools in Clonmel and Carrick has led to an upsurge of activity. St. Mary's Camogie Club is being revived and a girls football club has been formed in Clonmel.

Indoor Hurling — the development of indoor hurling at club and schools level has been a major success of the project. It has caught the imagination of boys and girls and is extremely popular as a winter sport for children up to 14 years of age. Indoor hurling is strongly recommended to any club which can organise a hall for the winter and information on the availability of the necessary playing gear is available from the Chairman.

Inter Club Competitions in Football and Hurling — off-season U13 competitions were run off between the clubs in Clonmel and Carrick-on-Suir. Carrick Swan won the hurling and the football final is planned for Autumn 1998.

Summer Camps which were attended by 450 children were hosted by Clonmel Óg, Carrick-on-Suir, Clonmel Commercials/St. Mary's and Marlfield.

Publicity — The Nationalist and Tipp FM provided excellent cover for the launch of the special development programme and continue to publicise results. John Cummins writes a Coaching Corner for the South Tipp Today newspaper which is distributed to 11,000 homes and is enormously popular with the children whose photographs and profiles are regularly featured.

Working in close harmony, the schools and clubs in Clonmel and Carrick, assisted by the Special Development Scheme under Johnny Cummins' able leadership and with the support of our generous sponsors, can chart a new revival in Gaelic games in our ancient towns. Ní neart go chur le chéile.



BALLINGARRY G.A.A.

Where Tipperary meets Kilkenny and Munster meets Leinster, Ballingarry GAA club pulls together the hills and lowlands watered by the Munster and Kings rivers. The Gaelic Athletic Association has a long and fruitful connection with the parish but it was not until the 1950s that the fiercely independent townlands bonded to make one proud club. The names of yesteryear - Mohober Rovers, the Commons Smith O'Briens, Slieveardagh Emmets, Ballingarry Harp and Shamrock, Boulea, Cuchulainns, Coolquill, Ballincurry, Knocknagow, Ballintaggert - are now draped with the famous maroon jersey. In Ballingarry, as elsewhere in Ireland, the GAA survived the bitter and sometimes hungry years of civil and economic wars and the ravages of emigration, which took the young in search of work or in the service of church and state. The creamery, the chapel, the convent, the farms, the mines, gave the parish substance and nurtured community life but the GAA gave it champions on the playing fields of Tipperary and Ireland. Slievenamon looks proudly on as new ground is readied for the green sward. It is a fitting memorial for the men and women from the land of no surrender who hosted Ireland's finest sons in 1848; it honours those who sleep in the graveyard on the hill for they were once young and met the flying sliotar and soared to catch the leather; it is for the players of today who have kept the faith and it is for those yet to be born. As the new century dawns a new field in Slieveardagh - the hill range of high meadows - takes shape, a field where everyone can play the game of their lives.
