





A Feasibility Study of the new proposal at Moyle Park was conducted by Irish Leisure Consultants in March 1999. In what was a busy year for this panel of players they also competed in Feile Peil na nOg, though they had little chance of success here due to fatigue, with this competition taking place so soon after the county championship.

Not to be outdone, the U12's captured their South A football title against Commercials and after a long wait, they too became worthy county champions, defeating Aherlow in Clonmel a few weeks ago. While they managed to reach the South U12A hurling final for the second year in a row they were pipped by St. Mary's, but how encouraging it is to see Moyle Rovers teams playing the 'small ball' game at the highest level!

The U10,s and U8,s are thankfully turning out in large numbers for training and are having lots of success in both hurling and football tournaments which augurs well for the future of the club.

A well-attended and most enjoyable summer camp was held in July, with up to two hundred boys and girls advancing their skills in hurling and football.

A major factor in the success of Moyle Rovers Juvenile Club is the large number of adults who give unselfishly of their time for the benefit of our youngsters, so a special word of thanks must go today to our hardworking secretaries, coaches and selectors.

CAHIR'S SOUTH FINAL APPEARANCES

Today's appearance will be the Cahir Club's fifth South Final, which seems a small return for over a century of senior football in the parish. There were in fact two senior football teams registered with the G.A.A. in 1887, i.e. Cahir Faughan-Ballagh and Poulmucka.

1923

Cahir had a fine team, with Jimmy McNamara an All-Ireland S.F. medal winner in 1920 and Gus O'Dwyer & William 'Bán' Burke, J.F. All-Ireland winners in 1923. They lost to the great Fethard team by 2-4 to 0-4 after 2 draws.

Having been Junior and having won two County Titles in 1952 and 1955, Cahir were back in the Final after 34 years again against Fethard. Once again they were unlucky to lose to a number of soft goals on a score of 3-5 to 1-7.







CAHIR G.A.A. DEVELOPMENT

Cahir G.A.A. club has gone into fast forward on the development front over the past 4/5 years under the Chairmanship of Pat Hyland ably assisted by treasurer Tom O'Donnell who has the onerous task of looking after the now large amount of money passing through the club and of course long term secretary Eddie Lonergan (he thinks he is secretary since 1982).

What we thought was a big job on the Dressing rooms was completed last year and before we

could take a rest after this the opportunity to acquire a second pitch came up.

Though the timing could have been better, the club decided the opportunity of becoming involved in the exciting Duneske Sports & Leisure project might not arise again and we committed ourselves as one third partners in this undertaking to take sport & leisure facilities for the town and surrounding areas into the 21st Century.

The remaining two partners in the project are the Cahir Development Association and Colaiste

Dun Iascaigh.

The plan is to provide extra playing fields for the Secondary school, to build a Sports & Leisure Complex along with all weather facilities and to provide a second pitch for Cahir G.A.A. who now cater for 20 teams consisting of Adult, Juvenile, Ladies Football and Camogie.

Funds for this project are currently being raised through a massive Lotto syndicate comprising of 1000 members. Cahir G.A.A. must sell one third of these tickets (330) at £20 a month each to pay for our portion of the project. All Gaels and people with interest in youth and sports generally are asked to respond favourably to support this initiative.





MULLINAHONE NOTES

SEAN BRETT: THE FORGOTTEN HURLER

Sean Brett who was born in 1967 is 34 this year. By the time that they were that age, Alexander the Great and Napolean had conquered most of the known world and indeed Jesus Christ had completed his work of saving the same planet.

Still, the Mullinahone veteran goes on as enthusiastic and determined now as he was when he first played on Mullinahone adult teams almost 20 years ago. Sean played on the Mullinahone team which won the South Tipp Junior Hurling Title in 1985. He was also there in 1986 when Ballingarry beat Mullinahone after a replayed final in the same championship, the starting point of today's rivalry and also the starting point of Mullinahone's rise to hurling eminence. Sean became a county footballer and played in the All Ireland minor final of 1984. In those days, it was the thing for Mullinahone's young men to aspire to. Sean made his mark in football circles, but ever the loyal



clubman, he too put his considerable hurling talents, not least of which was determination, at the disposal of "the green above the red". He was an outstanding fullback on the Mullinahone team of 1988, which brought the county under 21B double to the club. By now the 'Leahy factor' had emerged in Mullinahone hurling and the rise to hurling heights was on. In 1990 Sean made the Tipp Junior hurling team which reached the All Ireland final against Kilkenny. This game was played in O'Moore Park, Portlaoise. Sean gave a wonderful display at corner back, but Tipp lost. The greatness of Sean Brett is not measured in honours won but in obstacles overcome. At the peak of his career, Sean was sidelined with cruciate trouble. Not once, but twice, did Sean battle back to fitness to play in two Munster Senior Football finals in the mid 1990's. With such example in Mullinahone can anybody doubt that John Leahy will again hurl for Tipp? An essential part of Mullinahone's hurling odyssey through the nineties which saw the county final appearance of 1997 one of Sean's proudest moments was last December when he led the club to a county intermediate football victory and back into senior football ranks. Married to the former Aine O'Sullivan with one son Cathal (the makings of a centre back is the rumour) retirement must figure on Sean's agenda. Perhaps before he takes that final step there is just one more great challenge for Mullinahone's forgotten hurler to overcome.

Figures say:

Since Mullinahone won their first South Tipp Senior Hurling Title in 1993 they have repeated the feat every other year in 1995, 1997, 1999. This is 2001.

Underage Level:

Having gone through a lean spell for some years at underage level, Mullinahone could be on the way back. This year they appeared in 3 underage finals and won the U12B double in football and hurling. Four of the players on those teams, Sean Quirke, Kevin Walzer, Niall O'Brien and Richie Morrissey play in today's mini-games.

Six of the best:

Has a South Tipp SH final ever involved 6 players who were members of an All Ireland winning Tipperary Senior Hurling panel?

Today's patrons can see Ballingarry's Liam Cahill and Mullinahone's John Leahy, Brian O'Meara, Paul Kelly, Eoin Kelly and Paul Curran

Odds and Ends:

Sean Foxe (Mullinahone) won the South Tipp Feile Skills competition in 1991.

Liam Cahill (Ballingarry) won the "Player of the Tournament" in the Tony Forristal 14 tournament in 1991. Eoin Kelly (Mullinahone) repeated the feat in 1996.

Three of Mullinahone's hurlers played with Tipp Junior Footballers in the Munster Final this year. The "big ball" men were Pat Croke, Eddie Carey and Paul Cahill.

In Tipperary's N.H.L. win this year all of Mullinahone's "Famous Five" played a part on the field of play in either the semi-final or final against Galway and Clare.

In the 1987 South Tipp Junior Hurling championship Ballingarry's second string defeated Mullinahone's best in the first round. Six years later Mullinahone won their first South Tipp Senior hurling title.


