CLONOULTY'S 10th or KICKHAM'S 17th ?

West final appearances are familiar events for the present generation of hurlers in both Kickhams and Clonoulty\Rossmore. In fact not since 1991 has there been a final without the involvement of one or other of today's clubs. Kickhams have featured in six of the last ten finals, winning just two, while Clonoulty played in the other four, winning three of them. No shortage of experience of the big occasion then for either side, though, remarkably, the parishes have avoided each other in West finals since the 1950s.

Kickhams, though, might worry about their record in finals. Today they face the worrying prospect of losing three deciders in-a-row following defeats to Cappawhite in 2000 and 2001. On the other hand their presence in so many finals indicates a consistency. After so many letdowns 1997 was the breakthrough year for the Dundrum club when team captain, Kevin Farrell, announced the end of a 37-year famine following his side's defeat of Cappawhite in the final. Two years later they were back to claim a second, this time destroying Eire Og in one of the most onesided finals ever.

Clonoulty are no strangers to victory either. 1989 was their defining year taking West and county titles in one swoop after decades in the doldrums. Perhaps they should have won more in subsequent years, but instead Cashel K.C. took their place. They did claim three titles in the nineties and a second county crown in 1997, a year when Kickhams knocked them out of the West before they availed of a back door visa courtesy of the Crosco Cup.

So while the clubs have not been clashing in finals there's still plenty of history between them. Clonoulty's record outside the West is immeasurably better than Kickhams' but within the divisional boundary there have been some titanic tussles between these neighbours' children. The 1998 semi-final encounter between the pair is still readily recalled, taking two and a half hours hurling to eventually separate the sides.

This year neither club can be happy with their form en route to the final and both will be anxious to hit the right notes on the big day. Kickhams had a confidence-building win over today's opponents in the first round but were lucky to escape Galtee Rvs. in the semi-final. Clonoulty for their part had to regroup following that initial defeat and were less than impressive against Golden in their first losers' group engagement. They did better against Cappawhite the next day but in the semi-final against Cashel K.C. they were again glad to hear the final whistle.

To an outsider Clonoulty look the stronger side with plenty of well-known names throughout the team. Andrew Fryday in goal has given huge service to the club over the years while in front of him John Devane is one of the upcoming talents

that people will wish to see developing. Their half back line is likely to be formidable with the in-form Michael Heffernan, Aidan Butler and Liam Kearney expected to be on duty. Elsewhere 'Bonny' Kennedy will take some watching, as will an exciting young prospect called David Kennedy. Declan Ryan leads the charge in attack while team captain Kevin Ryan and Kevin Lanigan-Ryan are others who will figure prominently in their plans.

With fewer big-name personalities in their ranks Kickhams will need a steady input from all sectors if they are to curb Clonoulty. Fergal Horgan has great stopping ability in goal and team captain, Kevin Farrell, brings years of experience to the full back job. Damien McGrath has been one of the club's brightest prospects in recent years and they'll look to a big performance from him and from Brian Horgan in defence. The classy skill of Alan Horgan should be another asset to Kickhams while the experience of players like Vincent Kelly and John McCormack will be important also. Richard Horgan's free-taking can be invaluable and they'll need a scoring threat form the likes of John O'Brien and Ger Butler.

On past evidence it has the potential to be a cracking contest between two sides that hate losing to each other. Kickhams chase their 17th divisional crown while for Clonoulty the quest is for their 10th. The final verdict? Clonoulty to shade this one.



JOHN DEVANE (CLONOULTY/ROSSMORE)

Growing up John has had a keen interest in hurling and being successful brings its advantages to the big stage. Having claimed an U-12, U-14, U-16, minor and U-21 divisional medals, today adding a senior west medal would complete a handsome collection. Its John's third year on the team and a title of major significance is on the cards. In early 2000, Paddy McCormack and company were paying close attention to the best of the county's minor elite. John was included in the trials and showed enough potential to remain with the squad for the minor championship campaign. Unfortunately his progress was short-lived after incurring a serious knee injury in a club championship game. Key-hole surgery resulted but his determination enabled him to return in time for the club's senior ambitions at wing-back. At Thurles C.B.S., John began to show promise, winning a Harty Cup medal was top of his priorities. Disappointingly St Flannans and St Colman's terminated their involvement at the semi-final stage in 2000 and 2001. Operating at the centre of defence earned him the school's hurler of the year for his efforts. Turning the clock to 2001, the U-21 selectors came calling, with Tipp reaching the Munster final against Limerick at the Gaelic grounds. John as one of three Clonoulty-Rossmore players on the team marshalled the full-back position and despite reducing a ten point deficit lost agonisingly to a late controversial free. Just beginning a second term in public administration at University College Limerick, John can reflect on the previous twelve months of college life with great satisfaction. After claiming the Fitzgibbon Cup title, John made the full-back position his own. Containing a monumental range of intercounty talent, its no wonder UL were unstoppable in the competition. In direct opposition against Brian Begley, Tony Griffin, Michael Collins and in the final against Henry Sheffin, John gave consistent performances throughout. ClonoulyRossmore had a prolonged run in the championship last year with John giving one of his best ever displays against Nenagh in the county guarterfinal. His exploits yielded sufficient evidence for a call-up to the county panel last December. Nicky had been monitoring his progress closely and gave him games against Derry and Cork in the league campaign. Third in a family of five, he just turned twenty during the week. Ann-marie, Conor, Liam and Cait are all involved in hurling circles with parents Willie and Nora hugely supportive. When asked about his biggest disappointment, the recent U-21 Munster final loss is top of his list. Today is his first West final and he's determined to make it a victorious one.

ALAN HORGAN (KNOCKAVILLA/KICKHAMS)

One of Kickhams young guns is their newly installed right half back, Alan Horgan. Probably the black and amber's best performer in their unconvincing semi-final win with his long range points keeping them in touch at vital stages. Cool, calm and collected, Alan works with Curran road markings since finishing at Cashel Community School in 2000. He has won divisional medals at all grades only an



U-21 medal against Galtee Rovers in the coming weeks would complete his collection When Kickhams were last successful in 1999, Alan was a panel member, just out of the U- 16 and an integral member of the minor team. Despite being so young it's Alan's fourth consecutive West final appearance having established a regular place in the last two years. Second last in a family of ten, Alan is the youngest of three on the team. Richard is the teams current free-taker and a most accomplished golfer as a seven handicapper. Centre back Brian is a current Tipp senior panellist and captained the county's last U-21 success in 1995. Sister Joanne was also a successful captain at minor camogie in 1993. His momentum and enthusiasm has grown steadily over the last few months and his transformation from attack to defence has given the side an extra edge. Kilruane MacDonagh's Jim Williams was introduced at the start of the year and had made great progress with his training methods. Alan has been impressed by him and believes his coaching and guidance could end their west final drought this afternoon. As a county minor in 2000, Alan operated at wing-forward in their semifinal loss against Limerick. He also wore the county jersey at U-16 level in their unsuccessful run in the Nenagh Co-op Tournament. In 1999 the club's minors were performing heroically, with Alan at midfield in top form they reached Semple Stadium and a county final appearance only to lose against a formidable Thurles Sarsfields side. Losing that final was Alan's greatest disappointment but victory today would overshadow anything he has attained thus far. His cool headed approach and tremendous composure suggests that he should play a major part in today's decider. All in all, it accumulates for an eagerly anticipated West final to remember.
