Novel Final in the West.

A novel Tipperary Co-Op West senior hurling final brings three clubs to Dundrum in quest of glory on Sunday evening next. For Clonoulty/Rossmore it's a familiar visit, but for the combined intermediate forces of Golden and Annacarty it's a bid for a first ever. Clonoulty chase their 11th title in the grade - their last being in 2002 - and they'll be slight favourites to succeed.

Interestingly it's forty-one years since a combination side contested the West decider. In 1963 Lattin/Cullen and Solohead combined under the banner St. Patrick's to take the honours at the expense of another combination, Suir Rovers, a coalition made up of players from Golden and Galtee Rvs. That was during an era of combinations in the West.

Since then combination sides have fared poorly in the division with individual club loyalty very often an obstacle to team spirit. It's against that background that Eire Og and Golden, both recently relegated from senior ranks, decided to try their luck in combination in the present championship. Their season began badly when they looked dispirited in their opening match and were easy prey to reigning champions, Galtee Rvs. In the losers' section, however, they reformed to claw their way back into contention.

They emerged from the losers' group with an extraordinary win over Cappawhite. In the second half particularly they demolished their opponents to qualify for a semi-final date with Cashel K.C.Their progress continued in the semi

with the King Cormacs being out-scored by four points, 0-19 to 1-12.

Clonoulty's passage to the final has been more direct. After an undistinguished run in the county league they outplayed old rivals Kickhams in an opening bout. But it was surely in the semi-final that they made their strongest statement when ousting the reigning champions, Galtee Rvs., on a 2-12 to 0-15 score line. That victory was achieved without former county panellist, Aidan Butler, and present county minor, James Heffernan, the former on holiday and the latter injured. For this final Butler returns, though Heffernan's readiness remains uncertain.

As individual clubs, both Golden and Eire Og have contested recent West finals. In 1999 the Annacarty club lost heavily to Kickhams, while the previous year it was Golden's turn to lose narrowly to Clonoulty. Interestingly the clubs last clashed in a final in 1986 when Eire Og prevailed by 2-9 to 1-10; it was the club's last West final win. Golden have two West titles to their credit, their breakthrough year being 1969 before they followed up with another win in 1972.

Few people doubt the merits of individual players on the combo' side – it's the overall team cohesion that remains more questionable. Mark Bargary is a dependable goalie behind a defence in which Kevin McCarthy and Liam Mooney provide the backbone with Conor O'Brien adjusting impressively to duty on the wing. The Fogarty brothers from Golden, Brian and Aidan, play midfield; their father Joe was a key man in the Golden wins of 1969 and 1972.

David Fogarty, son of Jim and nephew of Munster chairman, Sean, leads the attack from the 'forty'. They'll also look to players like Ronan O'Brien, John Quinn, Shane Stapleton and county minor, Jim 'Bob' McCarthy, to find gaps in the Clonoulty rearguard.

For Clonoulty it has been a season in which they've reshaped their side out of necessity. The evergreen Andrew Fryday in goal remains a valuable link with the glory days of the past. Michael Heffernan has this year adapted very successfully to the full back role with David Kennedy now firmly established as a quality centre back. Con O'Keeffe has been defending impressively too.

In the semi-final the Kearneys, Liam and Stephen, were on midfield duty with Conor Ryan (C) playing a pivotal role at centre forward. County panellist John Devane was full forward that day with young Fiachra O'Keeffe in the corner. In previous games Aidan Butler played cen-

tre forward and his return on Sunday now presents them with a selection problem.

An interesting link between the sides is the fact that Eire Og's Kevin Fox coaches the Clonoulty side while his brother Pat is involved with the combination. The former Allstar manages the Eire Og intermediates while Limerick's Pat Heffernan does the coaching for the "combo".

The sheer novelty of the pairing brings its own appeal and should entice a large crowd to Dundrum on Sunday evening. It's new territory for the combination and represents a rare opportunity for the players to collect West championship medals. Clonoulty's established track record, however, at this level will make them the favourites in most assessments of the outcome.

Kickhams' Sean Bradshaw, one of the division's most promising referees, takes charge of his first final.



Profile on Past Player Michael Ryan (C)

Michael Ryan (C) or Mickey the Castle as he is better known locally is one of the sole survivors of the famous Eire Og team that won the County Senior Hurling Final in 1943. He was born in 1920 at Ballysheedy next to the O'Dwyer's of Kilnamanagh stronghold, Ballysheedy Castle. One of a family of nine, he attended Anacarty N.S. where his teacher for one year was the newly appointed principal, William(Bill) O'Donnell from Golden. Under Bill's tutelage Mickey began his hurling career winning some school's matches. He then moved on to Cappawhite Vocational school. The Eire Og club as we know it today was officially formed in 1936 and Mickey was on their Minor team. In 1937 and 1938 Eire Óg joined forces with Cappawhite in Minor Hurling and were called Brian Borus. Mickey won two West Minor Hurling medals with them. In 1937 he also won a West Junior Hurling medal when Eire Og defeated Solohead in the final. From 1941 to 1944 he won four West Senior Hurling medals and the enviable county medal in 1943 plus two Crosco Cup medals in 1944 and 1946. Eire Óg also contested the County Final of 1941 but were beaten by Boherlahan on the scoreline 2-02 to 0-06. 1942 saw them beaten in the County Semi-Final by Killenaule. In the 1943 West Final Eire 6g beat Cappawhite and Moycarkey/ Borris in the County Final on October 3rd, in

Thurles Sportsfield. Mickey played at left halfforward and was joined by his oldest brother Tom, the captain of the team, playing at left halfback and his youngest brother Philly (who won medals with both Tipperary and Dublin) playing at centre-back. A verse from a song penned at the time goes like this:

We had Phil and Tom the Castle,
Bill Donnell and Tom Burke
With Georgie Ryan and Jerry are the boys
that did the work
Not forgetting John and Jerry Whip,
Jack Cooney and Tom Joy
And also Mick the Castle,
sure they made the leather fly
Sure we can't leave out Jim Donnell,
Jim Hanly and Jack Dee
Not forgetting Denis Condon,
they made the ball go free.

Eire Og's years of glory came to an end after capturing the West Final of 1944. Mickey moved on to pastures new in July 1945 when he married Mary Joe O'Dwyer and moved a few miles up the road to Mohera where he still resides today. Mickey hung up his



boots in 1949 to concentrate on farming and family life. He reared a family of four boys and two girls, Patsy (Mohera), Philly (Dublin), Thomas (Dublin), Anne (Cork), Mai (Doon), and Gerard (Anacarty).

Mickey and Kitty are the only surviving members of his family. His father Philly died in March 1943 thus missing out on his sons' County Final success. When Tom died in 1986 the following verse was written:

Big Tom was captain of the team Playing centre-back was Phil And Michael in the forward line Showed courage, speed and skill.

Mickey's great hurling skill did not shine forth in any of his children and only today are some of his feats being emulated by his two grandsons, Gearoid and Liam who play underage for Eire 6g. One of Mickey's finest hours was seeing Gearoid receive a county medal in 2001 in U/12 B Football, though hurling is his first love. Still playing U/14, Gearoid has won six West medals and one County medal, and Liam at U/12 has one West medal. Both boys like their grandfather play in the forward line. Gearoid represented Eire Óg on ths year's U/14 West Hurling team.

Mickey is still hale and hearty at eighty-four and attends many a hurling match yet and would be delighted to see Eire Óg win the West Senior Hurling title as part of the combo with Golden.

Snippets

Eire Óg's first West Senior Hurling Title was achieved against Golden in 1941 by a mere point 4-04 to 3-06. Playing for Golden that day was Anacarty School principal Bill O'Donnell. In 1943 he transferred to Eire Óg, winning a West and County title with them.

Clonoulty's trainer Kevin Fox is the goalie for the Eire Óg Junior "B" Hurling Team on which his son Brian is a substitute also.

This is a novel final as Eire 6g have never played against Clonoulty in a West Senior Hurling Final and Golden played them in 1998, with Clonoulty winning by four points 0-12 to 0-08

Recent History

Eire Óg last contested a West Senior Hurling Final in 1999, losing to neighbours Kickhams. After poor showings in the 2000 and 2001 Senior Hurling campaigns, Eire Óg faced relegation matches, escaping in 2000, only to come unstuck in 2001, being beaten by both Carrick Swans and Silvermines by the merest of margins. Co-incidentally it was Silvermines whom Eire Óg beat in the Intermediate Hurling County Final of 1994 to be elevated to senior status.

Since the turn of the millennium the club has won three county titles in football, u/12 B, Junior and Intermediate in 2001. Last year Eire Óg contested the West Senior Football Final, going down to Galtee Rovers. Winning their first ever West U/21 A Hurling title in 2001 gave the club great hope for the future and most of the players involved feature in today's Senior Final as it was Clonoulty whom Eire Óg beat.

The club is at present undergoing a major new pitch development on which work has just commenced.

Eire Og's last success in Senior Hurling was achieved in 1986 when they beat their partners of today, Golden, in the final played in Dundrum on July 27th on the scoreline 2-09 to 1-10.

Playing for Eire Óg at comer forward that day was John Quinn who caused havoc for the Golden defence. As the "Daddy" of today's combo team, given the chance, he could wreak havoc on the Clonoulty defence. John was also a substitute on the winning Eire Óg team of 1981, when they beat Cappawhite in the West Final.

Eire Og's manager today, Pat Fox also played in 1986 as did substitute Anthony Crosse. Not playing for Eire Óg on final day in 1986, due to injury was Kevin Fox who today trains rivals Clonoulty.

So today's final pits the craftiness of one Fox against another Fox. " May the cleverest Fox win".

Changing Times for Clonoulty / Rossmore

The vicissitudes of sport are, perhaps, what make it such a compelling part of manypeople's lives. Clonoulty/Rossmore, like so many other clubs, has experienced the highs and the lows in the last ten years. From Co. Champions in 1997 and beaten finalists the following year, the club was on the brink of relegation to Intermediate status just last year. Our narrow escape at the expense of an unfortunate MoycarkyBorris brought a mixture of relief and foreboding in equal measure. We had retained our Senior status but what did the future hold?

Declan Ryan had been the talisman for so many of our achievements in the past and 2004 dawned with the realisation that the three time All-Star had donned the green and gold for the final time in the relegation final of 2003. Not many would have forecast earlier this year that the club would reach a West final without his influence but such is sport.

In the seven short years since 1997 our Senior team has been radically altered. Long-serving goalkeeper, Andrew Fryday, is the only player in today's final who survives in the same position as 1997. Full back, Noel Keane went on to win three Cork championships with Blackrock and is now retired from Senior hurling. Comer back, Micheal Ryan has not figured to date in this year's championship due to injury while the other comer back, Fr Peter Brennan, has retired and has recently been 'transferred' to New Inn. Former Inter-County star, John Kennedy, retired after the 1997 final while centre back, Aidan Butler, has been drafted to the half forwards. Michael Heffeman has been switched from the

wing to full back. Of the 1997 midfield duo, Kevin Ryan featured as a sub in our first round clash with Kickhams while Kevin Lanigan-Ryan has not played with the club for the last two seasons. Only Maurice Quirke of the 1997 forwards remains and captains the team today. Michael Brennan was forced into premature retirement through injury and Michael 'Bonny' Kennedy is in the U.S.A. James Ryan (H) has not hurled this year due to injury and Michael 'Shiner' Heffeman, man of the match in the 1997 final, is now chairman of the club!

It is interesting to note that five of today's first fifteen were members of the team that won the Co. Minor hurling final of 1996, Michael Heffeman, Con O'Keeffe, Liam Keamey, Conor Ryan and Alan Kennedy. Players of an even younger vintage have also graduated to the Senior team with David Kennedy and John Devane now key members of the side. Indeed, the club is proud to list John's name among those who have worn the blue and gold at Senior level in the years since 1987. He was also a key member of the Tipperary U-21 team which defeated Setanta and his fellow Cork warriors in last year's Munster final. Only last week, David Kennedy followed in his footsteps when Tipp again put the Rebel U-21s to the sword in Semple Stadium.

Current Co. Minor, James Heffeman, has also featured at wing back in this year's Senior championship against Kickhams, though unavailable for the semi-final through injury. Brian Ryan, Liam Devane, Stephen Keamey and Fiachra O'Keeffe are debutantes in Senior hurling this year, Stephen having won an All

Ireland Vocational Schools' medal at centre field for Tipperary in their win over Offaly at the end of April.

It is heartening to see the progress being made by the younger players on the team. 40 Years Ago

The senior hurling championship of 1963 once again attracted a number of junior combinations. Rosegreen and Rockwell Rvs. teamed up together to form St. Mary's, Lattin-Cullen and Solohead formed St. Patrick's and Golden and Bansha made up Suir Rovers.

There were seven affiliations for the championships with the following draw pairings; St. Mary's v. Kickhams;

St. Patrick's v. Eire Og;

Suir Rovers v. Cappawhite;

Clonoulty\R a bye.

The first round winners were Kickhams (5-4 to 2-7),

St Patrick's (5-12 to 4-3)

and Cappawhite (3-11 to 0-1).

The latter pair were through to the semifinals and Kickhams joined them when they defeated Clonoulty\ Rossmore by a single point 3-7 to 4-3, in the second round. The fourth semi-finalist came from the losers' group and here Eire Og put out St. Mary's (3-5 to 1-10) before being eliminated themselves by Suir Rovers. It took three games to separate this pair. At the first attempt they drew Eire Og 4-4, Suir Rovers 3-7. The replay also ended even, Eire Og 4-5, Suir Rovers 3-8, and no extra time was played because the game was late starting and the referee, Philip Ryan, Boherlahan, was unable to stay on for the extra period. The third meeting was equally tight but Sean McGovern tapped over the winning point from a free, Suir Rovers 2-12, Eire Og 4-5.

The first of the semi-finals was played at Golden on July 14th where St. Patrick's had a four point win wer Cappawhite, 2-9 to 2-5. The winners led 1-4 to 1-2 at half time and the local press report described the result as a sensation.

The second semi-final was played at Sean Treacy Park on August 8th and those three games with Eire Óg stood to Suir Rovers as they dismissed Kickhams comprehensively, 4-10 to 3-3. Kickhams led 2-2 to 2-1 at half time but clearly ran out of steam in the second period.

The final was staged at Golden on August 25th and refereed by Jim Devitt. It was a day that produced slippery conditions for the players and the hurling suffered as a consequence. St Patrick's led at half time by 3-2 to 0-3 and were good value for an end margin of 5-3 to 1-7. Jim Devitt sent four players off during the game. Paddy Verdon (St. Patrick's) and Michael Ryan (Suir Rovers) were each suspended for two months while B. Leahy (St. Patrick's) and D. Hickey (Suir Rovers) got one month terms. Afterwards Board chairman, Sean O'Dwyer, presented the O'Dwyer Cup to the winning captain, Jim Hassett.

In the county quarter final, played at Cashel, Mid runners-up, Moycarkey, were too good for the West champions, winning 6-5 to 4-2.


