First Time in West Final Since 1996

After the glory days of the years 1988 to 1995, during which the club won six West senior titles, Cathel King Cormac's decline could be said to have begun in the 1996 final at New Inn. Played on a windy August 18, Cashel, who were going for four titles in a row, crumbled dismally by 2-13 to 0-6 to Clonoulty-Rossmore. They could be said not to have recovered since. Clonoulty led by 1-7 to 0-2 at the interval but, with the strength of the wind, the expectation was that Cashel could recover and win. They didn't, scoring only four points in the second half. The losing side on the day was as follows: Kevin O'Sullivan, Liam Barron, Pat O'Donoghue, Michael Perdue, Joe O'Leary (capt.), Willie Fitzell, Raymie Ryan (0-2), Colm Bonnar, Ailbe Bonnar, Ronan O'Donoghue, Timmy Moloney (0-2), Idichael Butler, Conal Bonnar, T. J. Connolly (0-1), Seanie O'Donoghue (0-1). Sub: Barry Moloney for Ronan O'Donoghue. Subs. not used: Jason Connolly, Seamus Morrissey, Seanie Barron, Cormac O'Dwyer, Donie O'Donoghue, Cormac Ryan, Sean Morrissey, Jim O'Leary. Cashel lost the first round to Kickhams by I-11 to I-9 at Golden in 1997. They went on to win the losers group, beating Lattin-Cullen and Golden-Kilfeacle. They lost to Cappawhite by I-14 to I-12 in a quarter-final game at Tipperary.

Relegation arrived in 1998 and it was a knockout championship with one team relegated in the division. Cashel lost the first round to Cappawhite by 3-11 to 3-10 at Golden, but survived the relegation battle by beating Eire Og, 3-17 to 2-6 at Tipperary.

In 1999 Cashel lost to Kickhams by 2-6 to 1-7 in the first round at Golden, but went on to win the losers group by beating Clonoulty-Rossmore. They met Kickhams once again in the semi-final at Cappawhite, but lost by 2-11 to 1-16.

Cashel were beaten by Cappawhite, 2-13 to 3-9 in the first round at Tipperary in 2000. In the losers section they beat Eire Og by 1-19 to 3-10, but lost to Golden-Kilfeacle by 2-17 to 2-9 at Dundrum. In the relegation battle at New Inn on October 14, they survived by beating St. Mary's by 3-10 to 0-9.

In 2001 Cashel were beaten by Kickhams, 1-16 to 0-16, in the first round at Golden. They beat Eire Og by 5-11 to 1-6 in the losers group at Dundrum, but lost to Cappawhite by 3-13 to 2-9 at Tipperary. In the relegation battle at Clonmel on October 6, they survived by beating Carrick Swans by 1-13 to 1-8

Cashel beat Golden-Kilfeacle by 1-9 to 1-7 in the first round at Dundrum in 2002, but lost the semi-final to Clonoulty-Rossmore by 1-16 to 2-11 at Dundrum.

In 2003 Cashel defeated Galtee Rovers by 3-12 to 1-12 in the first round at Tipperary. Galtee went on to win the losers group and met Cashel in the semi-final at Golden, beating them by 2-15 to 0-15. Cashel then went into the qualifiers and were beaten 0-18 to 0-13 by Killenaule at Fethard.

In 2004 Cashel beat Cappawhite in the first round at Tipperary by 1-16 to 1-13, but were then shocked by the combination of Eire Og/Golden Kilfeacle by 0-19 to 1-12 at Cappawhite.

To sum up then, Cashel played twenty-four championship games since that defeat in New Inn in 1996. They won eleven and lost thirteen. More significantly they reached the semi-final four times in the eight years, losing on all occasions. This year their first round victory over Kickhams was also a semi-final, and they won to qualify for today's final, their first time to qualify for a final in nine years.

Player of the Past - John Darmody

John Darmody's career with the Cashel King Cormacs is one of the most distinguished. It began back in 1957 with a West juvenile title with Rosegreen, a title mind you that was taken away after an investigation, the club deemed to have had a few foreign bodies in its composition, and it continues to this day as a member of the senior committee, and a selector for today's team in the West final.

It's a huge career, not only in longevity, but also in commitment, dedication and devotion to service to the club. John has never given less than a hundred percent service, whether on the field of play, in the committee room, or working in Leahy Park, and the service remains undimmed and unrelenting to this day. John lined out for Cashel minors for three years, winning West titles in 1960 and 1961. In his third year, 1962, he was spotted by the county selectors and drafted into the panel. He won a Munster medal but the team gave a poor display against Kilkenny in the All-Ireland, going down by 3-6 to 0-9, their third year in a row to lose at this



stage. John was brought on as a sub in Croke Park to rescue the effort, but in vain.

Graduating to under-21 ranks John won a divisional medal in 1964 with the united parish team. Two years previously Cashel Crokes were founded, and the parish fielded two under-21 teams for two years. Cashel Crokes defeated Cashel King Cormacs in both years, and went on to win the West in 1963. John was on the losing side both years.

While the parish was divided no senior team was fielded, but two junior, and he played junior number 1, as it was called at the time. As a result of the unification in 1964, Cashel returned to senior and were beaten by Cappawhite in the semi-final. John was centreback on that team and he was to retain that position until 1980, winning divisional titles in 1965, 1971, 1975, 1976 and 1980. He came on as a sub in the 1981 championship, and played his final senior hurling in 1982, a senior career lasting nineteen seasons, and which would have been longer but for the late commencement in 1964, due to the divisions in the parish in 1962 and 1963. John also has four Crosco Cup titles to his credit, 1975, 1976, 1979 and 1981.

During this period John Darmody was widely recognised for his honest endeavour on the field. He was distinguished by his capacity to catch the ball, drive out and clear it. He was a fearless performer, a good, hard, honest player, with the ball his main target. He was dedicated to training, and was to be found in the field every evening. His finest hour in the red and green was against Davins in the county open draw game at Clonmel in 1969, when he lorded it at centreback, making the great Mick Roche seem an ordinary player.

After his senior days were over, John still hadn't enough. He turned out with the juniors and won a West title in 1984, and lost the final to Ballina by a mere point on a 1-6 to 1-5 scoreline, a game that Cashel had plenty of chances to win. He won a second divisional junior medal in 1986, before calling it a day

After such a long career dedicated to playing, it would have been natural to take a rest from it all. Not so, John. As early as 1972 he became involved in administration, and was elected vice-chairman of the club. Two years later he was treasurer. After some years out of administration he was back in as a senior committee member in 1990 and has remained a member since then. Anyone who cares to look at his attendance at meetings will find it's usually one hundred percent during the year.

John was a selector, together with Aengus Ryan and Brother Malone, for the minor hurling and football teams that won the county double in 1974. The hurlers won again in 1975, when John was still in charge. He was a selector with the under-21s in 1984 and 1985, and was a senior selector also during the two years, as well as in 1986. He came back in again in 1990 and continued in the position until 1997, contributing significantly to Cashel's outstanding success during these years. He returned again in 2002, and has been there since, inculcating into the players the passion and commitment he always showed when he donned the King Cormac's jersey.

Married to Bernie, the couple have three children, Niamh, Claire and John. They can be proud of a husband and father who has given so much to the Cashel King Cormacs, and who continues to serve the club with undiminished fervour.

Player Profile of the Past: Ger O'Neill (Cappawhite)

When one dwells over the recently announced West Tipperary team of the Millennium, it's easy to see that the eventual selected team features the majority from Cashel King Cormacs and Knockavilla Kickhams, with the remaining positions spread between, Clonoulty Rossmore, Sean Treacy's, Eire Og Annacarty, Lattin/Cullen and last but not least, Cappawhite.

When the Left comer forward position was being filled, Ger O'Neill had won the voter's choice. The long term ESB employee has experienced his fair share of success over the years. From a very early age, he began to show promise. At the Cappawhite Vocational School, it was easy to see that Ger was head and shoulders over the others. He almost solely carried the expectations in the county Vocational schools. Twenty five years



ago, in 1980, he proved to emerge as the club's last dual county player operating at wing back in the Minor football championship losing narrowly to the Kingdom, who in turn took the national title. He enjoyed better progress with the minor hurlers, before climbing the heights of All-Ireland honours. Hampered by a serious hand injury, he elected to play in the minor final against Wexford and contributed handsomely despite his ailment. The following year, he gained promotion to the U-21s in a period where it was hugely difficult to receive a starting berth, as the Premier County were hoping to complete a third successive title. Ger's hurling was incredible. He in turn made comer forward his own, scoring five points from open play and giving his direct opponent Dick O'Hara a torrid time throughout. It was no surprise when Nicky English pinpointed Ger O'Neill as one of the greatest hurlers he ever had the privilege to play with. Ger was very slight in his prime. Opponents under estimated his potential and suffered accordingly, His first touch, vision and accuracy made him the player he was. Nicky English paid him a great compliment when saying, "Ger was virtually unstoppable as an under age player, but his inter county career never quite received the longitude it deserved". In his final year on the U-21 's Tipp again reached the All -Ireland final but suffered at the hands of an inspired Galway side. In 1985, Ger made his championship debut in the blue and gold. His Munster final appearance against defending All Ireland champions Cork at Pairc Ui Chaoimh was to prove his finest hour, notching 1-3 from play despite Tipp's eventual 4-17 to 4-11 loss.

He was also making his presence felt on the club circuit. In 1983, Cappawhite finally came of age with a first senior West title since 1962. Ger added two more such titles in 1984 and 1985. His final pass to the unmarked Austin Buckley for the match winning goal in the closely fought '85 decider against Cashel clinched the three in a row. In 1987, Cappawhite reached the promised land claiming the county senior title, with Ger at full forward one of their chief scorers. They reached the Munster club final and Ger required pain killing injections to enable him to play, such was his importance to the team. In 1991, Ger received a call-up to the county team. He was introduced in their semi-final win over Galway, but due to their abundance of talent failed to make the starting line-up for the final as Tipp recorded their 24th All -Ireland title. Ger continued to play competitively for the club until 1998, acting as player manager. All the while he ventured into management, coaching the West Tipp U-16's to a provincial final in 1994. He further joined Dinny Cahill and Paudie Butler in helping Tipp record a first Minor All -Ireland title in 22 years in 1996. He also enjoyed a most productive spell guiding Galtee Rovers from Junior to senior status in four years, culminating in county Junior and Intermediate titles. After giving so much to the game he loved, he is truly one of the club's great ambassadors.





Raymie Ryan and T.J. Connolly hold six West Senior medals each. They were successful in 1988, 90, 91, 93, 94, 95. Meanwhile Cappawhite's sub goalkeeper, Pa O'Neill also holds six medals in 1983, 84, 85, 87, 2000 and 2001. Both sets of players are bidding for a seventh medal today. Incidentally, Kickhams John Farrell holds the record with 12 titles from 1946-60.

Two Cappawhite men hold Cork county senior hurling medals. John Kelly with UCC in 1970 and Conor Ryan (H) with St Finbarr's in 1993.

Cappawhite sharp shooter, Alan O'Neill on 1-11 is the Championship's highest scorer so far after two games.

Dicksboro's **Michael Walsh** is currently coaching Cashel King Cormacs. The former All-Ireland medal winner with Kilkenny in 1992 and 1993 was manager of the Carlow hurlers in recent times.

Cappawhite was successful in 1983 and 1985, with Cashel reversing the outcome in 1976 and 1991.

Cappawhite's Richard Barry refereed the 1995 Cashel v Kickhams decider. His umpires were Johnny Breen, Declan Sheehan, Mickey O'Neill and Willy Walsh.

The late Mickie Barry captained Waterford in the 1945 Munster championship and in turn was responsible for the change in the Cappawhite colours from blue and white to the white and blue of Waterford.

The Cappawhite captain, Paddy Julian. has won West Championship medals at all grades, from U-12, U-14, U-16, Minor & U-21. He claimed a West Junior 'A' title in 1997 and two senior equivalents in 2000 and 2001.
