

Many thanks to Seamus King, P.R.O. of the West Board for producing another excellent program for to-day's final. Now let's enjoy our 79th West senior hurling final.





West Tipperary Senior Hurling League/Championship 2008

This year's senior hurling championship in the West was a new departure. There was no qualification to get into it and no relegation as a result of playing in it. There were more games than ever before, with each of the six teams playing each other and the top four teams at the end of the league section qualifying for the semi-finals and the Dan Breen Cup. The two teams who failed to qualify went into the O'Riain Cup.

It was a most exciting championship with many and

regular games and the last qualifier for the semifinals not determined until the final game. At the end of the series Eire Óg headed the table with 7 points, followed by Clonoulty-Rossmore with 7 (on score difference), Cappawhite with 6 and Golden-Kilfeacle with 5. Under the system agreed Eire Óg played Golden-Kilfeacle, and Clonoulty-Rossmore played Cappawhite in the semi-finals, with Eire Óg and Clonoulty qualifying for today's decider. Cashel K.C. and Kickhams qualifed for the O'Riain Cup.

ClonoultyRossmore profile PETER HAYES

PETER HAYES was slightly perturbed at being selected 'Player of the Past' by his club, thought it put him in the Gallery of the Ancients, made him feel very much an also-ran.

In fact he is anything but! Not yet forty-eight years of age he is a very active man, might even be persuaded to make an appearance if the Junior Bs were stuck for a full-forward.

He was chosen in recognition of a life of service to Clonoulty-Rossmore, as a player, as a selector, as a team manager, as a former secretary of the club and as a current member of the executive committee.

Peter started playing senior hurling with the club when they affiliated at senior level for the first time. The year was 1981. Up to then Clonoulty-Rossmore had been affiliating at junior and intermediate level and were getting nowhere. Jim Ryan Hanna convinced them they'd be better off at senior level because they would get at least a number of games in the Crosco Cup.

There was no instant success. The championship was played on a knockout basis and Clonoulty were well beaten by Kickhams the first year, lost out to the same opposition in 1982, were badly beaten by Cappawhite in 1983 and 1984, more narrowly in 1985, and again in 1986.

The only success Peter enjoyed during these years was captaining Clonoulty to a Crosco Cup victory in 1985, his second year as captain of the senior team. Peter won four more Crosco Cup medals in 1988, 1989, 1991 and 1992.

Clonoulty eventually made the breakthrough by getting to the West final in 1987. Played at Cashel they looked certain winners as they led by nine points at the interval. According to Peter they had the chance to go even further ahead after the interval but then Cappawhite came after them with a dazzling display in the second half and beat them by eight points!

Clonoulty got revenge the following year when they defeated Cappawhite, who were then reigning county champions, by six points in the first round, only to lose by a greater margin to Cashel King Cormac's in the semi-final.

Peter admits there were great teams in the West in these years with three of them winning county finals in a five-year period. What Cappawhite did in 1987, Clonoulty were to do in 1989. In this year they not only made the long-awaited breakthrough in the West but went all the way to win the county title as well.

Clonoulty won impressively against Golden-Kilfeacle in the first round, against Kickhams in the semi-final, and eventually against Cappawhite at Emly in the final. Peter made a major contribution to this victory and it was recognised when he was awarded the Man of the Match Award. He scored one of their two goals in the first half and Clonoulty led by 2-8 to 2-6 at the interval. Peter had a second goal early in the second half and this set them up for a comprehensive 3-20 to 4-6 victory and their first title since 1951. They went on to beat Holycross in the county final, in a game in which Peter scored a crucial goal early in the second half, to record their first victory since 1888.

Cashel knocked Clonoulty out of the West the following year but Clonoulty returned the favour in the final of 1992 when they beat Cashel at Bansha. Peter was the goalscorer in the first half. This was the year of the controversy with the Mid clubs because of their refusal to play as fixed. The county quarter-finals eventually went ahead a month late and Peter is of the opinion that the delay set them back a lot and they were beaten by Thurles Sarsfields. Had the games gone ahead on the original fixture it might have been a different year for Clonoulty and for Peter.

Peter played senior in 1993 for the last time, leaving him with two West and one county senior hurling medals. He played junior A in 1994 and junior B for a number of years afterwards but without success.

Peter was a selector on the team when Clonoulty defeated Cashel in the West final at New Inn in 1996. He wasn't there the following year when the club, having lost out in the West championship, got back in by vicrtue of success in the Crosco and went on to win the county final.

While he was still playing Peter trained underage teams, most notably in 1988 and 1989 when Clonoulty won West titles but lost both county finals. More recently he looked after the under-12 team which won the last of of three county A titles in 2005. His son, Paul, was on the team. In the same year he helped Tom O'Brien to coach Clonoulty N.S. Seven-a-Side team to a county final.

Born in Clogher in 1960 Peter went to Clonoulty



National School before going on to Thurles CBS, where he won White, Croke and Fitzgerald Cup medals. He won two under-16 medals with the club as well as an under-21 title in 1981. After secondary school he spent a year at Rockwell Agricultural School before he went farming. While at Rockwell he won an All-Ireland 7-aside competition for agricultural schools.

At the inter-county level he didn't feature at minor or under-21 level but was drafted on to the Tipperary senior panel after the drawn Munster final in 1987, and has a Munster medal to show for it. He was retained on the panel the following year and won a National League medal when Tipperary beat Offaly in the 1988 final.

Whereas he never took football too seriously he played it when they were gone from the hurling, and did so with success. He won West and county junior medals in 1985 and West and county intermediate medals in 1986.

Peter served as club secretary for two years in the early eighties and has always had some involvement in the running of the club. At the moment he is a member of the executive committee of the club, which is supervising the redevelopment and transformation of their playing facilities outside the village.

Married to Anne, the couple have two children, Paul and Niamh. Peter will be remembered as a



Peter Hayes being interviewed by his brother, Joe, after Clonoulty won the third-in-a-row County Under 12 burling title in 2005


tremendous servant of the Clonoulty-Rossmore club, who always played his heart out when wearing the green and gold. His favourite positions were full-forward or centre-forward and, because of his size and strength, was a difficult player to watch. He was an important play-maker on a team, good to lay off the ball. Always having the club at heart when he was on the playing field, Peter continues to serve it with the same enthusiasm in many other capacities. He is worthy of recognition as the Player of the Past.

Clonoulty Rossmore a brief history

CLONOULTY-ROSSMORE was one of the first clubs in Tipperary when the GAA was founded. In 1888 the Clonoulty hurlers known as the "Botheen men" defeated Boherlahan to take Tipperary's second county hurling final.

When the West division was formed in 1930, Clonoulty had the honour of winning the first four West finals in 1930, 31, 32, 33. West titles have been won since in 1951, 1989, 1992, 1996, 1998, 2002, 2007. The highlight of the club's success was county senior titles in 1989 and 1997.

At present the club is undertaking a major development with two full playing pitches, a stand, new dressing room facilities and a walkway.

To achieve these ambitions major finance

Éire ÓgAnnacarty By Micheál O'Dwyer Donohill GAA

The Eire Og Annacarty/Donohill GAA club of today was formed in 1936 as a result of the enforcement of the parish rule. Before this there were other clubs and combinations in existence since the formation of the GAA in 1884.

Early success came at minor hurling in period 1937–1939 while joined with Cappawhite as Brian Boru's. Eire Og won the 1937 West junior hurling championship, setting up nicely for the breakthrough in the 1940s, winning 4 West senior hurling titles in a row (1941–1944) and winning the county title in 1943,

after losing the final in 1941.

The latter part of the 1940s and through the 50s was a quiet period success-wise until 1960 when claiming the West No. 1 junior hurling title. Eire Og joined with Cappawhite as St. Vincent's to claim the West SHC title, before landing the West SHC on their own in 1964 and 1967. The 1970s saw success in minor hurling along with county titles in junior football (1974), under-21 hurling (with Cappawhite) (1977) and the No.1 junior kurling (known now as intermediate hurling) in 1977. Eire Og landed 2 more West SHC titles in 1981 and 1986, before hurling fortunes declined in the late 80s and early 90s with the club going down to intermediate standard in 1991.

After claiming the county junior football title, hurling fortunes took an upturn by claiming the county intermediate title in 1994 after an epic final against Silvermines. This triggered a period of prolific success in underage activities, with the club annexing West tiles in under 16 hurling & football in 1997 & 1998, minor hurling & football in 1998 adding a county title in football, and under-21 A hurling in 2001. Also claiming under 12 titles in 2000 & 2001 in the West only to be runners-up in county finals.

Eire Og's period in senior hurling proved fruitless after 1994, apart from reaching the West final in 1999. In 2001 the club were relegated to the intermediate grade. 2001 also saw Eire Og claiming senior status in football in winning the county intermediate football along with the Junior B title for good measure. Following West titles in 2002 and 2004, senior status was regained in 2006, claiming West and county honours. Following relegation from senior the following season changes were made to the running of the senior hurling championship, allowing Eire Og the opportunity to play senior in 2008. So far, they have justified that decision to remain senior

by reaching this year's West final. Eire Og has reached the West final in senior football this year also.

The club is at present undergoing a major new pitch and dressing-rooms development on which work has commenced.

Eire Og's last success at senior hurling was in 1986, although they claimed the title as part of the Eire Og's Golden combo in 2004. John Quinn is the only survivor from the 1986 panel which featured current team manager Kevin Fox who missed the final through injury.



PADDY CORBETTÉire Óg

Paddy Corbett's hurling and football career spanned almost thirty years with Éire Óg Anacarty/Donohill, from the early fifties to nineteen eighty. He began playing in goals for the juniors at the tender age of fifteen and finished with the junior team at the end of his playing days. In his early years he played with some of the greats of the Éire Óg 1943 county hurling champions, Jerry Ryan and Jim Hanly, while in latter years he played alongside Tipperary stalwart Pat Fox.

Paddy is third youngest of a family of nine born to Walter and Mary Corbett of Newtown, Donohill. He attended Anacarty N.S. where he came under the influence of his teacher, Bill O' Donnell. Juvenile matches were only played between neighbouring parishes as there was no transport to further afield. He continued his education at the Abbey C.B.S. Tipperary town and was on the school's hurling team to win the first Dr. Kinane Cup, playing at right half forward. In the Dean Ryan Cup they were beaten by Limerick C.B.S. In fact it was his love of hurling rather than school that kept him attending.

Equally adept at football and as Eire Óg had no minor or senior football teams Paddy played both with Arravale Rovers on a gentlemen's agreement. They reached the county final but were beaten by Clonmel Commercials.

During the fifties he played junior hurling with Éire Óg and senior hurling with an Éire Óg/Clonoulty combo known as Young Irelanders. His versatility and ability to play in most positions on the field brought him to the attention of county selectors in both minor football and junior hurling.

On the Tipperary junior hurling team of 1957 he scored 3.01 against Kerry, marking Niall Sheehy. He was also part of the Tipp junior squad in 1960. Éire Óg were joined with Glengar in senior hurling and won the No 1 junior hurling championship beating Arravale Rovers 4.02 to 1.04. Paddy Corbett played at wing forward while his brothers John and Willie were playing at corner back and corner forward respectively. In 1961 he played at corner forward on the Éire Óg /Cappa team that won the West senior hurling final. Éire Óg won both the West junior hurling and football titles in 1962 and lost the hurling county final to

Thurles Kickhams by a mere point, when Thurles scored a goal in the dying moments of the game. This was the worst defeat experienced by Paddy. In 1964 Eire Óg won the West senior hurling final after a lapse of twenty years defeating Cappawhite 2.07 to 1.08. Paddy Corbett was unable to line out due to injury but he was ably represented by his brothers John and Willie. He won his last senior hurling medal in 1967 when Éire Óg beat Arravale Rovers in the final.

Paddy recalls 1974 as being the highlight of his playing career. While playing at full foward he won his first ever county medal when Eire Óg won the county junior football final beating Ballylooby 2.03 to 0.04. He attributes the success of football in the parish to the late Thady O'Carroll and then curate, the late Fr. John Walshe.

Following close on the heels of this success was the winning of the county junior hurling final in 1977 beating Upperchurch in Leahy Park, Cashel on December 11th on the scoreline 2.07 to 0.07. Paddy lined out at wing back. His last senior hurling match was in 1978 and he finally hung up his boots in 1980 after a few junior matches. He also mentions winning two tournament games against Garryspillane and South Liberties as being on his list of good games.

Paddy didn't have far to travel for training during his sporting life as the club was using the field opposite his house during some of this time. The Corbett name has always been synonymous with hurling fields in Anacarty and it is on John Corbett's land that the new pitch is being developed. Paddy's son Walter also followed the great tradition, playing with the club until last year. His link with today's team is the full back, Ollie Kelly who is married to Paddy's eldest daughter, Margaret.

Paddy is married to Maura(nee Mulcahy) and they have reared a family of five, Walter, Margaret, Eileen R.I.P., Mary and Geraldine. He now enjoys life with his family and grandchildren as he is retired from Tipp Co-Op, sponsors of the West senior hurling championship.

And so "Scott" as he is affectionately known to many would dearly love to see his beloved Éire Óg win the West senior hurling title in 2008 and perhaps the West senior football title too.

PETER O'SULLIVAN

impressive sporting achievements

ORK'S outstanding performance in the recent hurling qualifier, when they defied the odds to defeat Galway, has a parallel in one of the outstanding performances of Peter O'Sullivan's career. The occasion was the final twenty minutes of the 1970 Munster final after Liam King was sent off and Peter had replaced the off-form John O'Donoghue in goals. His defiant performance inspired Tipperary to an outstanding display and they would have pulled off a stunning victory had a John Flanagan shot gone into the net rather than barely wide.

Peter, who had been understudy to O'Donoghue for a number of years, took over as goalkeeper and went on to win and All-Ireland in 1971. He gave another fine display on the occasion and won Sports Star of the Week for his performance. His hurling career came to a premature end in 1972 when he was badly injured in a severe work accident.

Peter showed early promise and was on the successful Rosegreen juvenile team of 1957. He progressed to minor level, winning three West hurling titles in 1959, 1960 and 1961. In the last year he was also on the Tipperary minor team that won the Munster final but lost to Kilkenny in the All-Ireland final.

He moved up to under-21 level in his final year as minor and won the first of three West medals. The other two were in 1963 and 1964, when the competition progressed to the county for the first time and Cashel were beaten in the final by Roscrea. In the same year Peter was on the county team that won the first under-21 All-Ireland.

In 1963 Peter won a junior hurling All-Ireland when Tipperary defeated London in the final at Thurles. Also on that team were Babs Keating, Mick Roche and Jim Fogarty.

Peter's displays in goals at minor, junior and under-21 led to him being drafted in as sub-goalkeeper for the senior team. He won All-Ireland medals in 1964 and 1965 as well as National League medals in the same years. As a result of the 1965 Home Final victory he travelled with the team to the U.S. to play New York in the final proper. For the journey all the members of the team were outfitted with blazers and slacks, the first occasion that this happened. As well as winning two league medals Peter played in two losing finals, 1966 and 1971.

The Oireachtas was still a major tournament during the sixties and into the seventies and the winners got very attractive medals. Peter won five of these during his career, in 1963, 1964, 1965, 1970 and 1972. He played Railway Cup with Munster in 1972.

Parallel with Peter's successes at the intercounty level were his achievements with Cashel King Cormac's. He has five West senior hurling medals to his credit, won in 1965, 1971, 1975, 1976 and 1980.


Among his other achievements was to hold the position of county junior hurling selector in 1985 when Tipperary won the Munster final but went down to Wexford in the All-Ireland final, which was played at Kilkenny.

Peter was also a referee for about fifteen years. His most important match was the county junior hurling final between Moyne-Templetuohy and Ballina, played at Cashel in November 1990. He never put off a man during his career and continues his association with the job by doing umpire for John Ryan (B).



Tipperary Co-Operative Creamery Ltd. - A Brief History

At the beginning of the century, while co-operative creameries operated in districts adjacent to Tipperary, Tipperary town and its immediate environs were served only by proprietary creameries. Thus in 1908 Tipperary Co-operative Creamery was founded. The foundation stone was laid in 1908 and the creamery opened the following year in O'Brien Street, Tipperary, a separate location to the existing Station Road buildings. The turnover for the first year of trading was £13,000 and by 1924 the Society's turnover had risen ten fold reaching £130,000.

The beginning of the 1920s heralded a disastrous economic slump which continued into the 1930s. During these years, Cleeves, who were also processing in Tipperary Town at Station Road (now headquarters of Tipperary Co-op), experienced financial difficulties and went into liquidation. In 1928 the Government intervened and Cleeves became the Condensed Milk

Company of Ireland.

From 1918 to the 1940s due to the economic pressures a number of local creameries amalgamated with Tipperary Co-op: Alleen and Ballinard (1918), Carnahalla (1919), Donohill and Emly (1920's), Aherlow, Dungrud and Ballygriffin (1940's).

The 50s and early 60s were periods of stagnation in the dairy industry and in the co-operative movement. However, it was the 1970s before we saw real movement in this area. In 1971 Borrisoleigh Co-op amalgamated with Tipperary Co-op and in 1972 the Society acquired the Dairy Disposal Company's interest in the Tipperary area. Also in 1972 a new powder plant, service block, intake unit and laboratory were built at Station Road and bulk milk collection was introduced.

Solohead Co-op joined Tipperary in 1974 and the closing of the Old Branch Network began. A new administration block was built in 1978.

The building of a Continental Cheese Factory began in 1980. Further upgrades to the trading stores occurred during the 1980s and in 1990 a new retail store complex was built on the grounds of the original creamery at O'Brien Street, Tipperary.

Throughout the 1990s we saw the purchase of a cheese packaging and distribution business in France (Tippagral, 1990), the purchase of a retail supermarket (1997) and the commencement of commercialisation of mushrooms (1999).

Since the turn of the millennium we have seen the continual growth and development of the Society and the Co-op's business units. In 2002, due to the expansion of the specialised markets established in the US, a new Cheese 'Cut and Pack' facility was built.

After almost 26 years of service the cheese plant was decommissioned and replaced by a new specialised continental cheese plant. This plant went into service in early 2007. In the same year, Tipperary Co-op continued the growth of its international operations with the purchase of a French cuisine food company, Perrine. This company provides innovative and original food concepts to food manufacturers, foodservice operators and retailer deli-counters.

For generations Tipperary Co-op has provided a way of life and a sustainable income stream for the local economy. The ethos of its founding fathers has a clear resonance for all those involved, as Tipperary Co-op embarks on a second century of service and leadership.
