Today is a proud day for all Carrick Davin players, members and supporters, as we once again reach the South Tipperary Senior Hurling Final. It is an accumulation of the dedication, hard work and effort displayed by this group of players and mentors. These players have been loyal to the club over the years since starting out at juvenile level and today we thank all our juvenile coaches and mentors who have shaped and developed their skills and teamwork. Carrick Davins was founded almost 90 years ago in 1922. It was named in honour of Carrick on Suir man Maurice Davin who was the Gaelic Athletic Association's first President. Over that time span our club has achieved great successes on the field of play, most recently in 2011 with the Under 16 Football Team winning the County Football Championship and our Junior Hurlers winning the South Title. It is a number of years since we participated in the Junior Championship and we are lucky to have such a committed panel of players. Some of these have returned to game after a few years absence and it is good to see them back playing in the red and white. These successes ensure that Carrick Davins will be prominent in the field of play for many years to come. We have recently developed a state of the art flood-lit Astro-Turf pitch at our club and this has benefited enormously the training of all our teams, especially during the dark evenings. This Astro-Turf is available to hire also. It has been another good year for our juveniles winning an u/16 County Football Title The u/14's competed in this year's championship and the u/12's competed in a number of Blitz throughout the year the Astro-Turf has been extremely beneficial to us and the use of the Green School for our u/6, u/8, u/10 and u/12's will keep the young ones hurling for the winter. In these hard times it is a credit to our club and committee that we can offer these types of facilities free of charge to our members. We thank all involved for their hard work and promotion of the game with the juveniles. Another undertaking was the establishment of the Ladies Football section has generated great interest in football amongst girls in Carrick and they are displaying huge potential. Some have begun training with the Tipperary U 12's County Panel, another great achievement for our club. We thank all the Ladies Committee for their hard work and dedication in getting this off the ground.

2011 C.J. KICHAMS GAA CLUB MULLINAHONE

Today we play Carrick Davins, a club with a rich history in our divisional senior hurling final which gives me an opportunity to look at our own history. Founded in 1885 the early years of the club focused mainly on football. In the early years we produced many great players who played an active role not only with their club but also with Tipperary. In 1920 on Bloody Sunday we provided six players to the Tipperary football panel. As the years progressed we developed an interest in hurling in the club and for many years we entered various junior and juvenile championships the big break came in the eighties with the arrival of a young John Leahy. John laid the charge at senior county level and was to start an era in the club which would culminate in the County Senior Hurling Title in 2002. The previous year under the charge of Nicky English he was joined by Brian O'Meara, Paul Curran and the Kelly Brothers Paul and Eoin. All the while we were moving forward as a club improving our facilities and building our own sports complex. These developments were a tribute to the many members who gave so much of their time as volunteers. When we were formed little did we know that a Mullinahone player would Captain and bring home the Liam McCarthy to his county and his native Mullinahone. That Tuesday night will live long in the memories of many Gaels. Little did our founders think 125 years ago that such an event would take place 2011 we entered U18 hurling and football, U21 hurling and football, Intermediate football and Senior hurling team making sure that our tradition of football and hurling still carries to this day. We thank the many players and team mentors who promoted and took part in our championships this year. We thank our supporters who support us vocally and financially. We thank our sponsors Mullinahone Co-Op for their support and belief in our club.

Of course in every club there has to be a juvenile club to ensure we have players into the future. We are very lucky in this respect to have such a dedicated juvenile committee who work tirelessly to promote our games. The annual U12 Inter County hurling tournament is now admired nationally with many clubs seeking to play in it. This year along with many teams from the republic we had Naomh Eoin Belfast, O'Donovan Rossa, Kevin Lynch's Dungiven, Eoghan Ruadh Tyrone and Castleblaney Monaghan. Our host families in the parish housed over eighty children and in all over six hundred U12's and U10's enjoyed a great weekend in Mullinahone. We sincerely thank our juvenile club for their dedication.

I wonder did our founders think that their idea of founding a GAA club would have such an effect on the life style of our community. Did they foresee that 2010 would yield the Tipperary senior hurling captain along with the Liam McCarthy cup, two all-stars, three senior hurling panellists, an All-ireland winning U21 player, two county minors and a member of the Tipperary senior football team. We've come a long way 'For the credit of the little village'.

PAST 100 YEARS OF SOUTH SENIOR HURLING

100 Years 1911

Ten Teams took part in the South Championship St Ailbes Emly, Suir Side Rovers, Two Mile Borris, Tipperary, Donaskeigh, Cashel King Cormacks, Fethard, Racecourse, Graigue Lower, Donohill, St Ailbes and Racecourse progressed to the Final with the game played in Donaskeigh, Racecourse proved much the better team and took the title for the third successive year on a score line 4-2 to 1-2, however Emly side objected on the grounds that 7 of the team lived in Boherlahan, on an Appeal to County Board match was awarded to St Ailbes Emly the Team Jack Raleigh Captain, Tom & Morgan Burke, Jim & Mick Noonan, Dan Moloney, Mick Murphy, Tom Raleigh, Morgan Quinn, William Fitzgerald, William Crowe, William Hickey, Tim Keeffe, Tim Nyhan, Terence Higgins, Tom Burke, Willie O Meara, in the County Emly Objection had not been heard when Racecourse played Toomevara in the Semi Final and lost by narrowest of margins 1-2 to 1-1.

50 Years 1961

South Senior Hurling teams Rd 1 Marlfield v Carrick Swans, Newcastle v Killenaule, Coolmoyne v Eire Og/Ballybacon Grange (Liam Lynchs), Carrick on Suir A ByeRd 1 success for Marlfield, Liam Lynchs, & Killenaule with the Semi Finals played in Kilsheelan on 16th July Coolmoyne 9-3 Liam Lynchs 5-3, Marlfield 3-7 Carrick On Suir 4-3 with a magnificent dual on that day between Theo English and a young minor called Mick Roche, the Final was played in Fethard before a capacity attendance and new Champions were crowned as holders Marlfield succumbed to the challenge of Killenaule on a score line Killenaule 2-9 Marlfield 1-6 with top performances on the day from Johnny Hanley at midfield scoring 5 points, the stylish Sean Walsh scoring 2 points with his constant running at the defence Willie O Grady who played superb at wing back with Marlfield's best on the day Theo & Austy English, Killenaule Team, P Tynan, J Cooke, N Cooke, Paddy Browne, B Croke, D Fogarty, Willie O Grady, L Barrett, Johnny Hanley, M O Meara, Tom Ryan, Sean Walsh, L Fanning, P Maher, J Daly the Referee was Tommy Foran Carrick On Suir only six teams qualified for the County Q Finals Killenaule losing to Borrisokane 2-8 to 2-1.

25 Years 1986

The Senior Hurling teams numbered 6 in the South Championship with a knockout system Rd 1 St Augustines (Kilsheelan/Fethard) v Carrick Davins, Carrick Swans v St Marys, Eire Og (Killenaule/Mullinahone) v Ballingarry first rounds played on May 4th with St Augustines v Davins a Draw, Carrick Swans accounting for St Marys by 2 points, with Eire Og winning easily v Ballingarry, in the replay Davins beat St Augustines, the stage was set for Losers Group play Off St Marys trounced a below par St Augustines only to lose out to Ballingarry, circumstances dictated that both Semi Finals be played in Fethard on a Saturday evening, the games when they did take place were disappointing one sided affairs Eire Og defeated Davins 5-11 to 2-8, Carrick Swans 5-13 Ballingarry 2-7 with the Final now fixed for Clonmel it drew a large attendance with Carrick Swans confirming their favourites tag 0-13 to 2-4 with outstanding displays from Gerry Walsh Centre Back, Maurice Walsh, Thomas Waters, Sean & Tony Fitzpatrick, & Maurice Grace the winners team Willie Barrett, Kevin Nugent, Dick Lonergan, Maurice Walsh, Paul Walsh, Gerry Walsh, Sean O'Shea, Maurice Grace, Paddy Murphy, Brendan White, Thomas Waters, Sean Cronin, Michael J Russell, Sean Fitzpatrick. Bobby Lonergan, Sub Tony Fitzpatrick for Kevin Nugent. In County Q Finals Swans went under in the County Borrisileigh 3-17 Swans 5-3 Kilruane 4-13 Eire Og 1-6.
