

The Cast



Moll (Juanita Guidera) sees herself as the saving grace of the parish - the right hand of the canon, protector of the people and she considers it her single-handed duty to put manners on the curates by any means necessary. What the curates deem the devil's tricks, Moll thinks will be character building and the route to their salvation.

Canon Pratt (Ger Meagher) is your typical 'old style' Canon, a quiet easy going man who likes his food and is in heaven when left to read his newspaper in front of the fire – the arrival of Moll certainly shakes up his world!



Fr Brest (Edmond Ryan) was used to living a comfortable life, playing golf and eating well, that is until Moll arrives and he has to learn about mal-nutrition and bingo! Although he complains, Moll has the upper hand and when push comes to shove, he tends to back down.

Fr Loran (Desmond Cunningham) is the younger and more placid of the two curates. Although he isn't happy with the new regime, he doesn't complain and chooses to hide behind Fr Brest & accept things the way they are for a quiet life.



The Bishop (Michael Hennessy) is a self-important man whose impending visit to the parish puts the fear of God into Canon Pratt and his curates.

Miss Andover (Maggie Morrissey) is also interested the Housekeeper's position or perhaps it's the Alter wine she is really after!

Ulick (Jim Malone) is an elderly parishioner with a few quid and a nice pension in search of a wife.

Bridgie (Amanda Kirwan) plans to marry Ulick – getting her hands on his pension is what she is really after!

Fr. Tom (Tom Callery) & Fr. Colum (Colum Dunne) give us an insight into Canon Pratt's world and the events taking place in the presbytery.



The Play

Moll is a hilarious and highly successful comedy set in a rural presbytery in Kerry. When Canon Pratt and his two curates, Father Brest and Father Loran, lose their esteemed housekeeper Miss Bottomly, they must recruit a replacement to carry on with the cooking and cleaning. They select Miss Maureen Kettle, aka Moll. Moll would work for no less than a canon, for in her own words 't'would be a great come-down to me to have to work with an ordinary priest'. The newly appointed Moll takes over the parish house with a "divide and conquer" strategy. Her methods are malicious while the priests' responses to them are what make this play hilarious. She wraps the Canon around her little finger, feeds him well while starving the curates. When it comes to the question of Moll's pension, more chaos ensues – however Moll proves to be an unstoppable force.


