## The Play

Lend Me A Tenor sees Henry Saunders, the general manager of the Clonmel Grand Opera Company, primed to welcome world famous, Tito Merelli, Il Stupendo, the greatest tenor of his generation, to appear for one night only as Otello.

The star arrives late and, through a hilarious series of mishaps, is given a double dose of tranquilizers and passes out. His pulse is so low that Saunders and his assistant Max believe he's dead. In a frantic attempt to salvage the evening, Saunders persuades Max to get into Merelli's Otello costume and fool the audience into thinking he's Il Stupendo. Max succeeds admirably, but Merelli comes to and gets into his other costume ready to perform. Now two Otellos are running around in costume and two women are running around in lingerie, each thinking she is with Il Stupendo. This madcap, screwball comedy is guaranteed to leave audiences teary-eyed with laughter.



#### **Ricky Dunne - Henry Saunders**

Ricky Dunne joined Clonmel Theatre Guild in 2006 making his debut in "Why not wait till Breakfast" and has been part of many productions since then including "The Chastitute", where he played the part of Mickey Molly, one of his favourites. Blathnaid has always had an interest in theatre, having taken part in several plays while she was in school. She is hoping to study drama in the future.



#### Edmond Ryan - Tito Merelli

Edmond Ryan joined Clonmel Theatre Guild in 1984. His first play was "The Real Inspector Hound". This play "Lend me a Tenor" will be his 33<sup>rd</sup> over the last 34 years and the Guild's 110<sup>th</sup> production in 50 years. Other productions he has been in over the years were "Dancing at Lughnasa", "Noises Off", "A Doll's House", "Cripple of Inishmahon", "The Crucible", "Run for your Wife", "Da", "Moll" and "The Chastitute" to name a few. He was Artistic Director from 2006 to 2012 and again in 2015 & 2016. Edmond has also designed and built the set for many of the guild's productions including this one.



#### Patricia Harte - Maria

Patricia Harte has been a member of Clonmel Theatre Guild for 32 years and during that time she has had the honour of being Artistic Director and has both directed and taken parts in many plays. She has also acted with various other groups including Brewery Lane & Quay Players to name two. Patricia has taken part in a radio soap and two films. Over the years she has come to cherish the many great friendships she has formed and feels privileged to have been influenced by so many talented people.



#### Esther Byrne - Diana

Esther Byrne, a native of Clonmel, has literally grown up "on the stage". A long-standing member of both St Mary's Choral Society & Clonmel Theatre Guild. She is a three-time Chairperson of the Guild and has also produced and directed for them. Esther has played 41 Principal Roles in 61 productions to-date. Her most recent parts were with the Brewery Lane Drama Group, Carrickon-Suir in April & June this year. She has been a singer, dancer and actor all her life and has several Diplomas in Theatre Training, Mime, Drama & Film.

#### About the Author

Ken Ludwig (Playwright) is a two-time Olivier Award-winning playwright whose work is performed every night of the year throughout the world in more than 30 countries and over 20 languages. He has written 24 plays and musicals, with six Broadway productions and seven in London's West End. His Tony Award-winning play Lend Me a Tenor was called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century" by The Washington Post. His other plays and musicals include Crazy for You (five years on Broadway, Tony Award for Best Musical), Moon Over Buffalo (Broadway and West End), The Adventures of Tom Sawyer (Broadway), Treasure Island (West End), Twentieth Century (Broadway), Leading Ladies, Shakespeare in Hollywood, The Three Musketeers, The Game's Afoot, The Fox on the Fairway, The Beaux' Stratagem, Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery, and A Comedy of Tenors. His critically acclaimed adaptation of Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express, written at the request of the Christie Estate, premiered this season to sold-out houses at McCarter Theatre Center in Princeton, and his world-premiere adaptation of Robin Hood! opens at The Old Globe this summer. Mr. Ludwig has received commissions from The Royal Shakespeare Company, The Bristol Old Vic and The Old Globe, and he is a Sallie B. Goodman Fellow of McCarter Theatre. His many awards and honours include the Charles MacArthur Award, two Helen Hayes Awards, the Southeastern Theatre Conference Distinguished Career Award, the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year, and the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theatre. His book How to Teach Your Children Shakespeare (Random House) won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of 2014, and his essays are published by The Yale Review. He holds degrees from Harvard and Cambridge University.
