Extract from District Inspector's Report on
Tipperary Male Poor Law Union National School,
visited on 22 February 1886.



The general proficiency of the classes, with the exception of that of Third Class, is unsatisfactory.

In the fourth class very little instruction has been given except in Penmanship and Geography.

The teaching of Agriculture in accordance with the requirements of the Programme has been attempted within the past few months but without much success.

The habit of prompting and copying
is prevalent and so long as this pernicious
habit is tolerated the school cannot
be placed in a satisfactory state of
efficiency.

The boys are in other respects
well-conducted, and clean and tidy in
appearance.

The school accounts have been
correctly kept and an adequate supply
of books and other requisites has been
maintained.
