
# The Butlers of Ballyslatteen: two Famine notebooks

Among the papers of Professor William F. Butler of Queen's College, Cork (1869-1930) are two Famine notebooks of interest to readers of this Journal. One (entitled Notebook A in this article) comprises a "List of Butler Tenants before the Famine", and the other (entitled Notebook B in this article) is headed "Famine Relief Meal Fund (Ballyslatteen) 1847" and comprises a list of subscriptions to that fund.

Both notebooks are identical in appearance and measure approx.  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ins. (9 cm) across and 6 ins. (15 cms) down. They are to be found at Ref. U82, 1-12 (specifically in Box 12, File 17) in the Boole Library, University College, Cork, and are reproduced below with the permission of the Librarian of the Boole Library. The copies obtained for publication in this Journal have been deposited with the Local Studies Dept. of the Co. Library, Thurles.

Because they have been carefully preserved and are still quite legible (allowing for minor instances of blurred or illegible handwriting), only minor explanatory footnotes have been added in an attempt to eludicate some apparent obscurities. The placenames mentioned all more or less adjoin each other in the Golden-New Inn area. They range in extent from 977 acres (Lagganstown) to 250 acres (Suirville), and are all situated in the civil parish of Relickmurry and Athassel.

Prof. Butler belonged to a well-known Catholic landed family in Co. Tipperary and was the son of Thomas Butler (1837-1919) of Ballyslatteen, who served as a magistrate in Cos. Down, Clare, Cork and Kerry. The professor was Professor of Modern Languages in Queen's College, Cork from 1895 to 1910, and Registrar of QUC from 1906 to 1910. An Assistant Commissioner for Intermediate Education in Ireland, he was also a member of the Irish Manuscripts Commission and the Royal Irish Academy, a council member of the Cork Historical & Archaeological Society and a fellow and (1928-1930) president of the Royal Society of Antiquaries for Ireland.

In addition to numerous articles in the Journal of the Cork H & A Society Journal and the Journal of the RSAI, he was the author of *The Lombard Communes* (1906), *Confiscation in Irish History* (1917) and *Gleanings from Irish History* (1925). He resided in Mount Verdon House, Cork, now 66 Wellington Road. Amongst his papers (preserved in UCC) are notes on Irish history comprising documents copied from the Public Record Office's original manuscripts, lost when the building in the Four Courts complex housing the PRO was destroyed in 1922 during the Civil War.

Prof. Butler's paternal grandfather, Richard Butler (1792-1870), married Elinor Dillon of Donnybrook, then in Co. Dublin. According to pencilled notes on the two Famine notebooks in what is identifiable (from the rest of his papers in UCC) as the professor's hand, it was his grandfather Richard and the latter's wife Elinor who compiled both Notebooks.

Readers of this Journal may be interested in two other biographical details regarding the Butler Family. Prof. Butler's great-grandfather, John Butler (1747-1801) of Ballycarron, married Alice Scully of Kilfacle, a member of another notable Catholic family of Co. Tipperary; see "The Scullys of Kilfeacle" by James O'Donoghue in *THJ 1989* (pp. 38-51), and "William Scully of Ballycohey" by Gerard Moran in *THJ 1992* (pp. 63-74). Finally, Prof. Butler should not be confused with his more famous namesake and uncle, Lt. General Sir William Butler of Bansha Castle – friend of Parnell; Home Ruler; supporter of the Irish language movement; Senator of the National University and for ten years *aide-de-camp* to Queen Victoria – who died in 1910.
